



# Leicestershire's Local Offer Annual Report

The **'Local Offer'** is the phrase used to describe what is on offer for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities and their families across Leicestershire.

The purpose of this report is to describe the things that we have done to develop our Local Offer and how we have responded to what children, young people, families and professionals have told us.



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# 1. Key features of the SEND Local Offer

Every local area has to have a Local Offer, as set out in the Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) Code of Practice 2015. Leicestershire's Local Offer brings together useful information across education, health and social care into one place. It contains a wide range of information, advice and guidance on a range of local service providers who support children and young people with SEND.

# The Leicestershire Local Offer is made up of the following:

#### The Local Offer website

We work closely with the Leicestershire SEND Hub (Leicestershire's Parent Carer Forum) and take on feedback from the experiences of using the Local Offer by SEND Hub members through the SEND Hub representative that sits on the Leicestershire Local Offer Steering Group. We also gather the voice of children, young people and families through events, focus groups and other forms of feedback. We use this information to help us improve the website, plan Roadshows and develop services.

#### **Local Offer Roadshows**

There are six Local Offer Roadshows that take place across each District/Borough, taking the Local Offer out on the road. A range of service providers are available at each roadshow to speak to with parent/carers and other professionals about their service offer.

#### Local Offer Facebook page

The Facebook page contains up-to-date information on activities and events that are available for children and young people with SEND. Like and follow the page to get regular notifications.

#### Leicestershire Information and Support Directory

The Leicestershire's Information and Support Directory sits on Leicestershire County Council's web site. Organisations and providers request to be included within the directory and a search facility is available.

# 2. 2024 at a glance...

### First Interactive Event at County Hall -Children & Young Peoples Roadshow September 2024:

During 2024 plans were put in place to deliver the first ever Local Offer Roadshow which positively welcomed the attendance of children and young people at County Hall and included suitable activities and information to engage with. Delivered alongside colleagues from Leicestershire County Council Youth & Justice team, an exciting array of activities including, skittles, a sensory room, biscuit decoration and music were delivered to over 30 children and young people. This extra dimension created an audible buzz around County Hall and the feedback from those attending indicated that this was an engaging and successful Roadshow. As well as showcasing services, the Local Offer was keen to capture the voice of children and young people as well as their accompanying adults as part of a continuous process to ensure the voice and views of Leicestershire families are heard and fed back through to the appropriate county council departments for consideration and action. Children and young people were invited to answer a question on what activities they did within their local area. They were given the option to write it down, draw a picture or select a picture. The district/ borough where they lived was also noted on a map of Leicestershire. 20 families participated in this activity with 21 children and young people adding their voice to the tree. Responses were shared with Shaping SEND Futures and Leicestershire SEND and Inclusion Board to enable gaps to be identified and solutions sought




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children and young people adding their voice to the tree



This was the highest attended Roadshow of 2024 attracting 146 visitors to County Hall. The inclusion of children and young people was successful, prompting discussion to repeat the event. Plans are already afoot for another exciting children and young people friendly Roadshow in 2025...



**167 stallholders** supported **6 Roadshows** around the County (Melton, Charnwood, Market Harborough, North West Leicestershire, Blaby, Hinckley & Bosworth), with **484 visitors** attending during 2024. A **41% increase on 2023** visitor numbers.

- SEND Summer Ideas






Parents, carers and professionals accessed the online sessions

### The Local Offer out in the Community

#### School & Parent/Carer visits:

The Local Offer continued to spread the word across Leicestershire during 2024, engaging with children, young people, parents/carers and professionals to gather voice and increase understanding of the Local Offer.

Visiting parent/carer coffee mornings in primary schools in Market Harborough, Blaby and Hinckley & Bosworth and a secondary special school in Charnwood. We shared information, listened and actively responded to feedback from 47 parents/carers.

#### You told us:

- Where you go to find information about SEND
  - How you like to access information
  - What type of information you are looking for
  - What support you have found the most helpful
  - What support you still need

#### Based on the responses we were able to:

- Send bespoke information back into schools to support families further
- Share responses with senior service managers to ensure feedback is considered and acted upon by relevant services
- Feedback suggestions to the Local Offer Steering group to influence and direct planned improvements to the website
- Share responses with Shaping SEND Futures and Leicestershire SEND and Inclusion Board to enable gaps to be identified and solutions sought

#### **Family Hub Visits:**

We attended 3 SEND parent/carer groups in Ashby, Coalville & Melton. The groups are delivered by colleagues from Family Help in Family Hub's around the county. 15 Parents and carers shared their experiences regarding:

- Specialist provision
- Education Health Care Plan timeframes
- The quality of EHCP's
- The lack of support from school

#### The Local Offer provided additional information/support to the groups:

- Signposting to the SEND Provision In Leicestershire Directory (SPIL)
- Advised re: support available from Leicestershire Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Information Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS)
- Shared the concerns with relevant senior service managers


# 3. Local Offer Data:

2024 provided the first full year of data collection following changes in 2023 introduced by Google relating to the way data around webpage visits is handled by organisations.

With 2 months of missing data for 2023, a true comparison will only be available in 2026.

The data below shows a significant increase (over 50%) in webpage users, page views and sessions on the Local Offer webpages. Almost 50% of those visiting the Local offer webpages include new users:

## Send Provision in Leicestershire - Directory & Guide:

Working closely with our partners, the Leicestershire SEND Hub, December 2023 saw the launch of the SEND Provision in Leicestershire (SPIL) guide and directory. The purpose was to present a comparison between different types of educational settings and provision available to support children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities.

Since then, the SPIL has consistently been the most downloaded document during 2024!

#### What is the toolkit?

This toolkit has been produced to support colleagues in meeting need and achieving the best outcomes for our children and young people. It allows mainstream schools to understand what is expected of them, as well as identifying additional avenues for support when a child/young person needs it. It is not a 'tick-list' and illustrates how a needs-based approach should be used.

#### Who can use it?

- Parent/carers can use this toolkit to better understand the resources available to providers
- Schools can use this toolkit as plans are made to meet pupil or student needs, and to understand what is expected of them. It is primarily aimed at both mainstream primary and secondary settings.
- The Local Authority can use this toolkit as part of decision making to understand whether despite the setting appropriately applying the Graduated Response, provision is needed for the pupil that is over and above what is ordinarily available.

#### Who has been involved in producing it?

The toolkit has been produced with the support of SENCo's, Headteachers, Parent/Carers, Educational Psychologists, Specialist Teaching Services, SENA (The Special Educational Needs Assessment Service within Leicestershire County Council), the Transformation Unit and others. It has drawn on the existing Local Offer and the SEND Handbook and must be read in the context of The Equality Act (2010), the SEND Code of Practice, the National High Needs funding approach, and the Children and Families Act and associated legislation and regulations.

### Facebook:

Facebook remains the most efficient and effective channel for sharing information, activities and services in an accessible and responsive way.

With collaboration from the Childcare Sufficiency team, the Local Offer Facebook page continues to grow its followers.



The page currently attracts **4.6K followers**, a **41%** increase on 2022 -2023 figures.

Interaction with the page has increased by **44%** highlighting that followers are keen to access inclusive clubs and activities as well as gain support and advice from professionals.
