To understand Prevent which is part of the UK's counter terrorism strategy, which looks at identifying individuals who may be becoming involved in or supporting terrorism. Prevent is part of Safeguarding.

This training has been updated in line with the revised Prevent Duty Guidance 2023. The updated guidance includes within the term 'Education Providers'; Registered Early Years Childcare Settings and Registered Later Years Childcare Settings. For these 'settings' staff should have sufficient training to be able to recognise susceptibility to terrorism and be aware of what action to take in response, including the setting's internal Prevent referral arrangements, training should be proportionate to the risk of terrorism and extremism in their local area - Leicestershire is currently substantial - an attack is likely. The Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSL) or Prevent lead in the setting should attend training at least every two years, enabling the lead to support other staff on Prevent matters and update them on relevant issues.

Scene Assessment & Priorities, Managing an unresponsive child & infant who is breathing (Recovery Position), Managing an unresponsive child & infant who is not breathing(Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation [CPR] and AED), Choking, Anaphylaxis & Auto-injectors – including practical scenarios with training model adrenaline auto-injectors (epi-pen, jext and emerade), Hypovolemic Shock recognition and treatment, Seizures inc. Febrile convulsions & Epilepsy, Management of Wounds and bleeding, Eye injuries, Foreign bodies Eyes; Ears; Noses, Bites and Stings, Electric shock recognition and response, Medical Conditions; Sickle cell; Revision of Diabetes/Hypoglycaemia (Low Blood Sugar); Meningitis.

Practical Skills Assessment: including scene assessment, recovery position, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), use of the AED, choking and casualty management, Ongoing informal assessment throughout, including end-of-unit quick quizzes during, eLearning and a number of activities during classroom-based training including questions and answers, group activities, case studies and scenarios.
