COVID-19 Vaccination & Immunosuppressed Children for AW 25/26 Campaign

Children aged 6 months to 18yrs with weakened immune systems are eligible if they have:

- Organ, bone marrow, or stem cell transplants
- Systemic steroid treatment lasting more than a month
- HIV infection
- Chemotherapy or radiotherapy
- Immunosuppressive or immunomodulating biological therapy, including those about to start such treatment
- Long-term immunosuppressive treatment
- Haematological malignancies, such as chronic leukaemia or lymphoma
- Genetic disorders affecting the immune system

COVID-19 Vaccination & Over 18s With Weakened Immune System for AW 25/26 Campaign

Adults aged 18 and over with weakened immune systems are eligible for vaccination, eg:

- Organ, bone marrow, or stem cell transplant recipientss
- Systemic steroid treatment lasting more than a month
- HIV infection
- Chemotherapy or radiotherapy
- Immunosuppressive or immunomodulating biological therapy, including those about to start such treatment
- Long-term immunosuppressive treatment
- Haematological malignancies, such as chronic leukaemia or lymphoma
- Genetic disorders affecting the immune system

These criteria apply to individuals aged 6 months an over, but are especially relevant for adults under 75, who are not otherwise eligible by age. [COVID-19: Green Book, Chapter 14a](#)



Flu Vaccination & Children in Clinical Risk Groups for AW 25/26 Campaign

Children aged 6 months to under 18 years qualify for a flu vaccination if they have conditions listed in Chapter 19 of the Green Book (Influenza). These include:

- Chronic respiratory disease (e.g. asthma requiring continuous or repeated use of steroids)
- Chronic heart disease
- Chronic kidney disease
- Chronic liver disease
- Chronic neurological disease (e.g. cerebral palsy, epilepsy)
- Diabetes mellitus
- Immunosuppression (due to disease or treatment, including chemotherapy, radiotherapy, long-term steroids, or immunomodulators)
- Asplenia or splenic dysfunction
- Children with learning disabilities (where flu may exacerbate health issues)
- Morbid obesity (BMI $\geq$ 40)

Flu Vaccination & Adults in Clinical Risk Groups for AW 25/26 Campaign

Adults (18 years and over) are eligible if they fall into one of these clinical risk groups:

- Chronic respiratory disease, eg asthma requiring continuous/repeated use of inhaled/systemic steroids; COPD, bronchitis, emphysema
- Chronic heart disease, eg congenital heart disease, heart failure, coronary artery disease
- Chronic kidney disease, including those on dialysis or with nephrotic syndrome
- Chronic liver disease, eg cirrhosis, hepatitis
- Chronic neurological disease, eg Parkinson's disease, motor neurone disease, multiple sclerosis, cerebral palsy
- Diabetes mellitus, Type 1 and Type 2
- Immunosuppression, due to disease (eg HIV) or treatment (eg chemotherapy, long-term steroids)
- Asplenia or splenic dysfunction, including sickle cell disease and hereditary spherocytosis
- Morbid obesity, BMI ≥ 40
- Learning disabilities, where flu may exacerbate health issues or complicate care
- Severe mental illness, where physical health is compromised
