Notice is hereby given in accordance with the Education and Inspections Act 2006 and The School Organisation (Prescribed Alterations to Maintained Schools) (England) Regulations 2013 (updated October 2018) that Leicestershire County Council of County Hall, Glenfield, Leicester LE3 8RF proposes to provide new Enhanced Resource Bases at:

St Botolph's Church of England Primary School (a voluntary controlled School), Forest Street,  
Loughborough, Leicestershire LE12 9DA

The unit will have 30 places for pupils. The units will primarily provide places for 1 academic year at a time. The unit will start with EYFS moving through 7 years of primary education finishing at year 6. The unit will be set out as 10 places for KS1, 10 places Yr 3/Yr4 and 10 places for Yr5/Yr6. The arrangement will begin from September 2025 and will be accommodated in the existing school building.

Woodcote Primary School (a community School), Willowbrook Close, Ashby de-la-Zouch,  
Leicestershire, LE65 1JX

The unit will have 10 places for pupils. The units will primarily provide places for 1 academic year at a time. The unit will start with EYFS moving through 7 years of primary education finishing at year 6. The arrangement will begin from September 2025 and will be accommodated in the existing school building.

St Hardulph's Church of England Primary School (a voluntary controlled school), Main Street,  
Breedon-on-the Hill, Derby DE73 8AN

The unit will have 10 places for pupils. The units will primarily provide places for 1 academic year at a time. The unit will start with EYFS moving through 7 years of primary education finishing at year 6. The arrangement will begin from October 2025 and will be accommodated in the existing school building.
