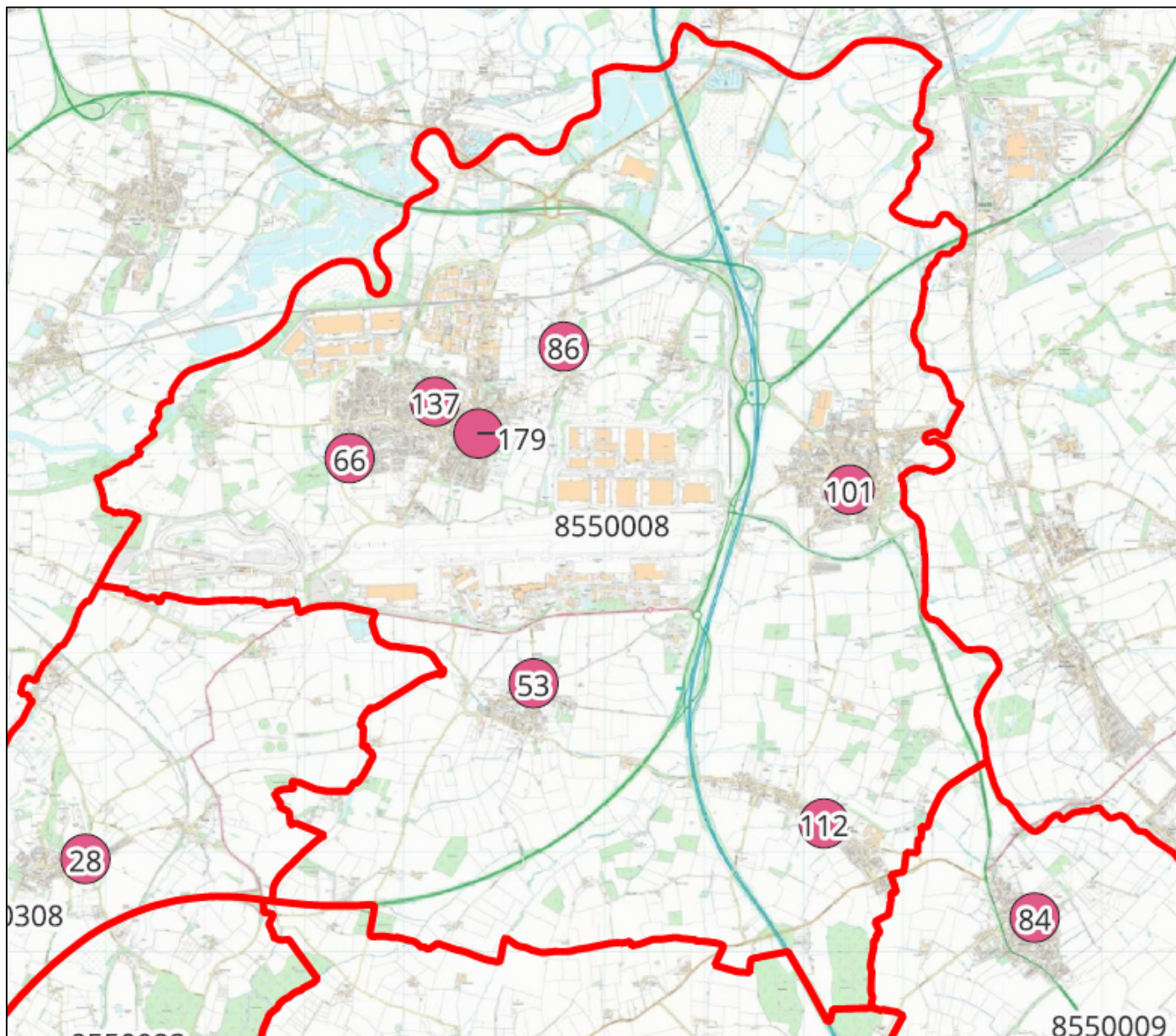

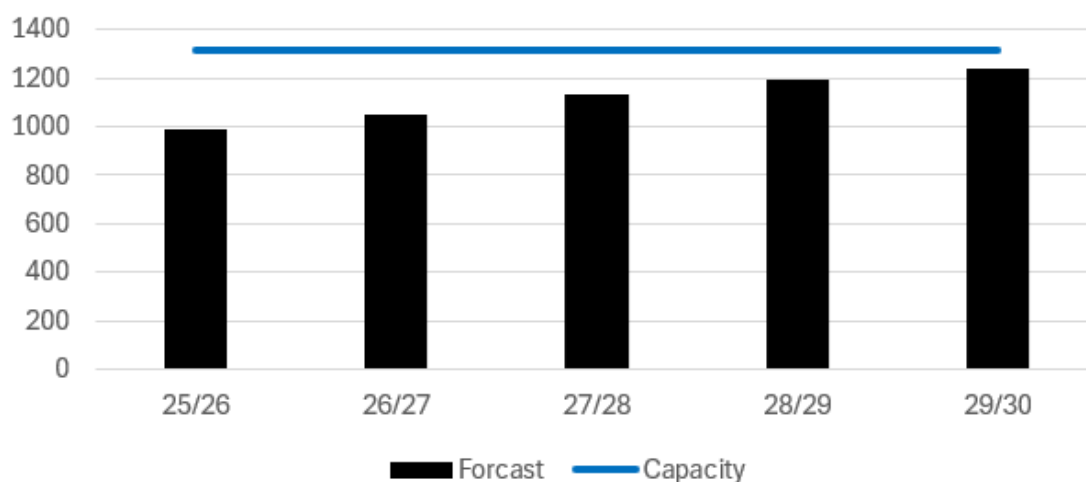

Current Overview

2053 – Kegworth Primary – High level of in catchment attendance. High housing gain forecast now starting to materialise with further gain expected in next few years. No other primary school within 2-mile available walking route.

2178 – Castle Donington Orchard Primary – Increased pupil numbers due to completion of large housing development in catchment (which is over half occupied, approximately 480 left), more housing expected as part of new local plan. A high number of pupil gains and losses to and from St Edward's Church of England Primary School.

3021 – Castle Donington St Edwards – Some out catchment pupils. No major housing in catchment. Low numbers.

2047- Foxbridge Primary School – Opened September 2022. Forecasts show school able to cope with expected housing growth in catchment until 2029/20230.

3029 & 2056 – Diseworth Primary School and Hemington Primary School – Low pupil forecasts. High surplus of places.

3054- Long Whatton – Pupil forecasts are stable

Future Actions

Overall, the planning area has sufficient places when comparing the total net capacity of the combined schools and the highest pupil forecast year (2029/2030). Large housing development as part of Local Plan (approximately 1,000 homes – currently applying for planning permission). A new primary school in the area will be required to manage additional pupils.

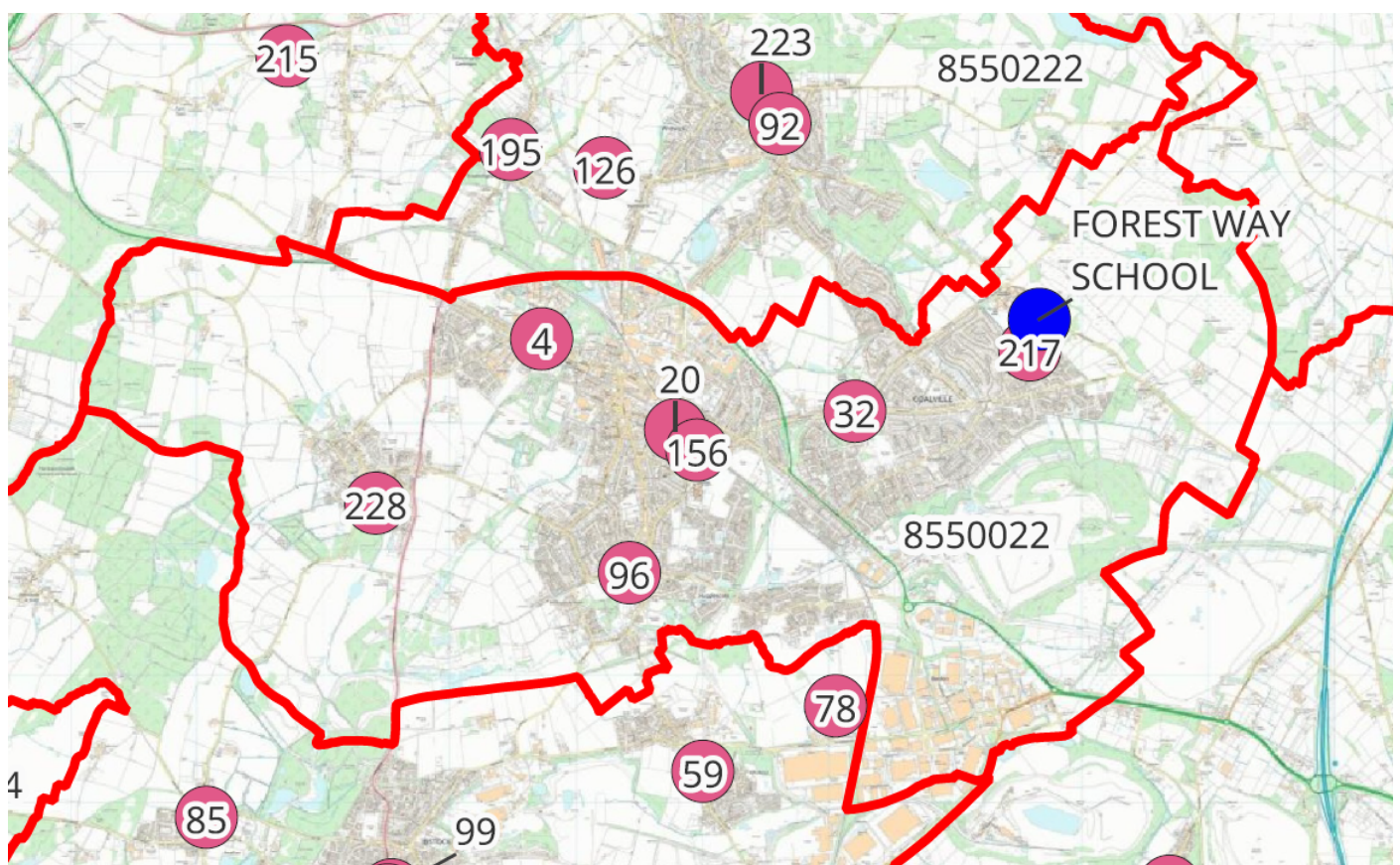

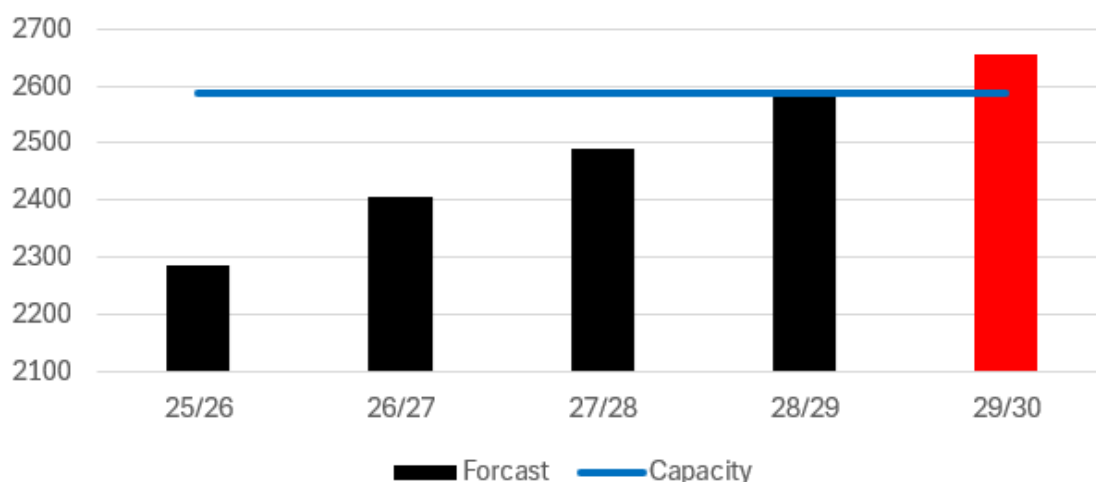


A map showing the Coalville Hugglescote Woodstone Primary planning area. There are 8 primary schools. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.

Current Overview

3022 – All Saints Church of England Primary - Significant housing growth within the catchment. Large in and out catchment movement. Capacity of school expected to be exceeded in future years.

2025 Woodstone Primary - is a very popular school, with housing developments in catchment, but school still gain some out of catchment pupils. Forecast numbers indicate school is nearing full capacity.

2360 Broom Leys School no significant housing gain in catchment and pupil forecasts are stable.

2024 Hugglescote Community Primary - There is significant housing growth, a lot of which has now commenced. Sustainable Urban Extension in catchment which include two new primary schools. Forecasts show a high deficit in places. Hugglescote has recently expanded to 630 capacity (maximum site capacity)– a new three classroom block was completed and is coming into use August 25.

2020 Belvoirdale Community Primary - lots of in out catchment movement to the school. There is housing growth occurring in the local area. A deficit of places forecast by 26/27. Will continue to monitor forecast pupils closely.

3348 - Saint Clare's Primary School is a Catholic Voluntary Academy – Surplus of places and no significant housing gain planned.

Greenstone Primary School – First year of opening is 25/26 academic year and will fill incrementally from reception age.

2177 – Warren Hills Community Primary School – Surplus of places and no significant housing gain within 2-mile radius.

Future Actions

3022 – All Saints Church of England Primary – A strategic approach to education solutions for housing growth has been taken. Enhancements at Hugglescote and two new primary schools in the area in coming years (see below).

2025 – Woodstone Primary – School reluctant to go to mixed age classes and are not prepared to increase admission number less than one full form of entry. The extension at Hugglescote and Greenstone Primary School (new forest school opening 25/26 academic year) will provide spaces at schools within 2 miles of the housing developments. There is also a further additional primary school proposed at Lower Bardon.

2024 Hugglescote Community Primary – A new classroom block has recently been completed allowing the school to increase to 630 capacity and provide places for forecast pupils. This paired with the new forest school will provide sufficient places.

2020 Belvoirdale Community Primary – A new intervention building has recently been completed. This will provide a breakout space for SEND pupils / classroom base as preferred by the school.

There are two new primary schools proposed in the area: Greenstone Primary (Forest School) will open August 25 and Lower Bardon Primary School – yet to be built. The two schools will meet the demand for the surplus of pupils in the areas of high growth. Greenstone also has land available to increase by one form of entry if required.

Overall, the planning area has sufficient places when comparing the total net capacity of the combined schools and the highest pupil forecast year (2029/2030). Though this has a surplus of

just 11 places but does not take account of the full capacity of Greenstone (420 pupils) and the new primary school at Lower Bardon which is yet to be built.

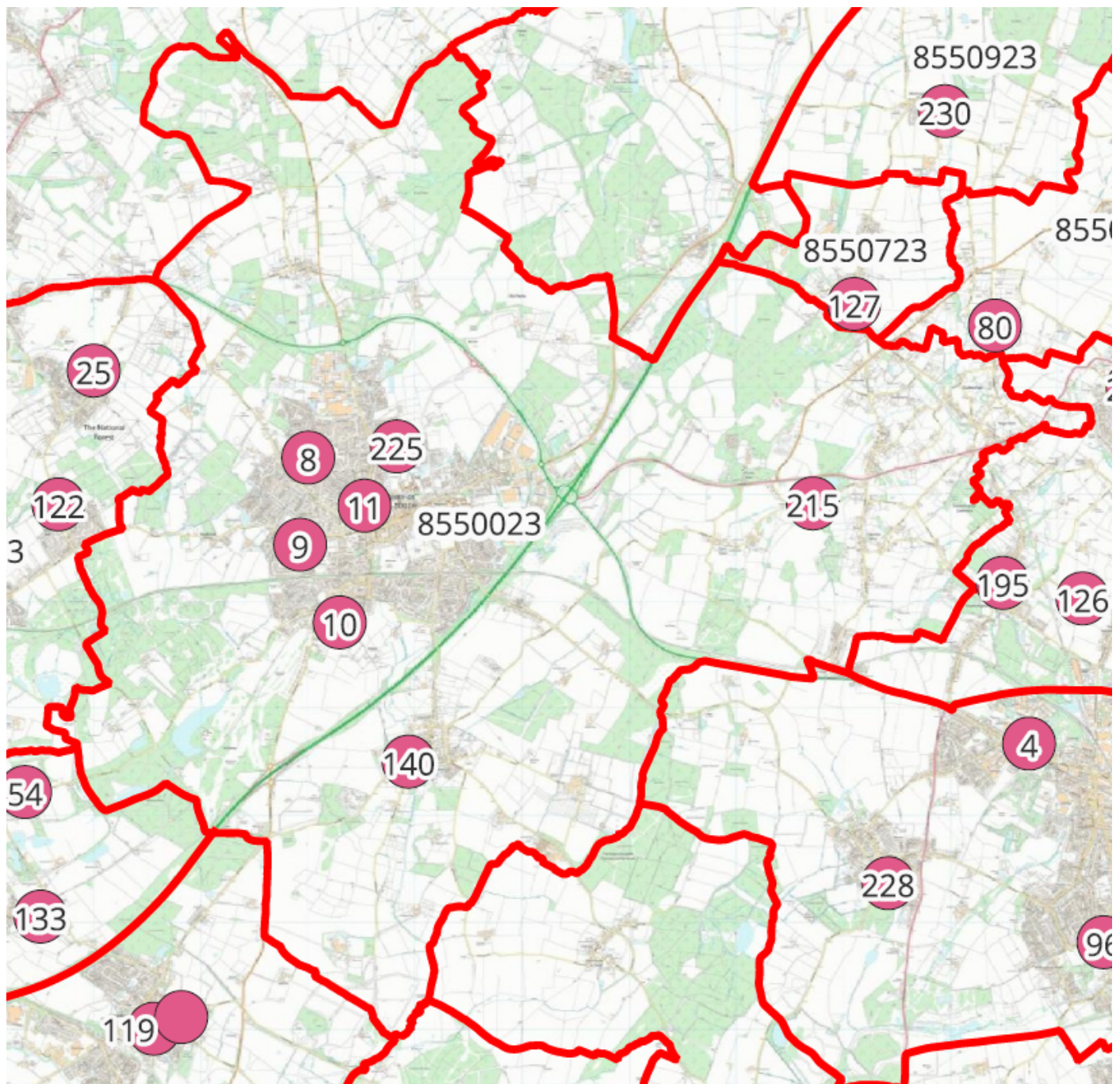

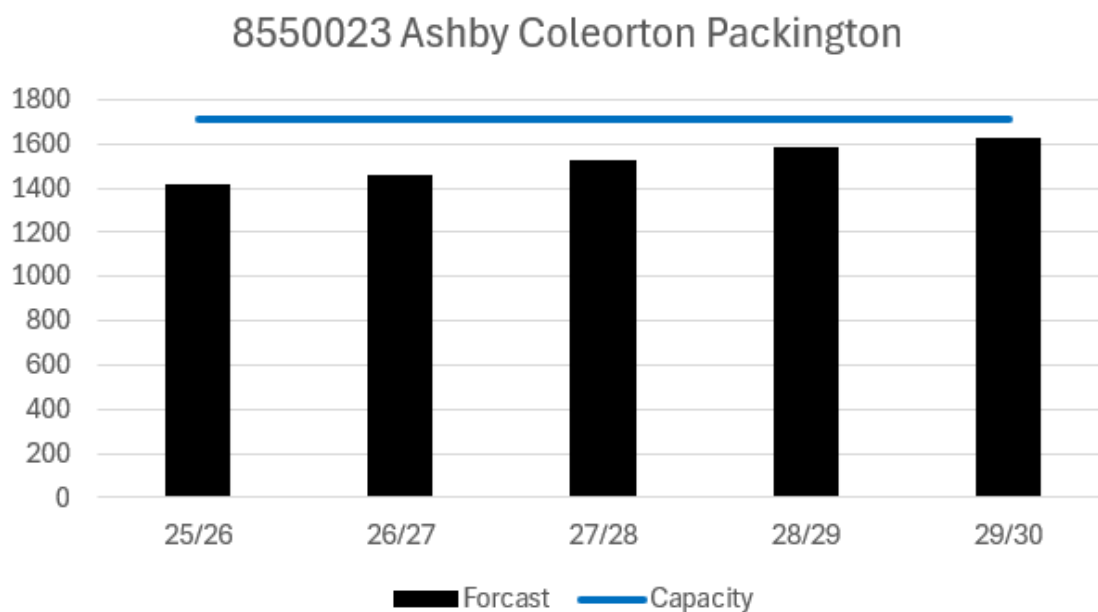

Current Overview

2321 – Ashby Hill Top Primary – Very popular school. Large amounts of housing construction in catchment which is well underway. Pupil forecasts expected to be above school capacity by a maximum of 5 pupils.

2167 – Ashby Willesley Primary - Capacity for forecast pupils up until 28/29.

3212 – Ashby CE Primary – In and out catchment movement across the five schools in the town. Forecasts show surplus capacity. School is planning on reducing capacity to one form of entry due to low pupil numbers and finance deficit.

3068 – Packington Primary – Births in catchment constant and broadly in line with admission number. High out catchment attendance.

2041 - Ashby Hastings Primary School – opened in 2021. Filling incrementally, forecasts show reaching capacity in 29/30 – very popular school.

2373- Woodcote Primary – There is a large amount of housing being delivered within the catchment. The school forecasts show increase in pupil numbers as years progress.

3305 – Viscount Beaumont – No concerns over forecasts.

Housing growth in the local area – Money Hill site, impacting all of the planning area.

Future Actions

2373- Woodcote Primary - The school are using some spare capacity in the primary school to accommodate EYFS SEND to open in August 2025.

School Organisation have had a meeting recently regarding pupil forecasts and the strained financial positions of maintained schools within Ashby. A strategic approach is required as there is housing growth which is requiring a new school via s106 obligations. Currently this is confirmed as a new one form entry primary school, but this may be extended to a two-form entry school due to the level of growth in the area, as identified within the emerging NWLDC Local Plan. More certainty over the housing growth will become apparent as the Local Plan progresses, with the next stage of consultation expected over spring/summer 2026.

Schools with low pupil numbers are being monitored.

Overall, the planning area has sufficient places when comparing the total net capacity of the combined schools and the highest pupil forecast year (2029/2030). Although this has a surplus of just 35 places it does not take account of the new primary school at the Money Hill development, which is yet to be built.

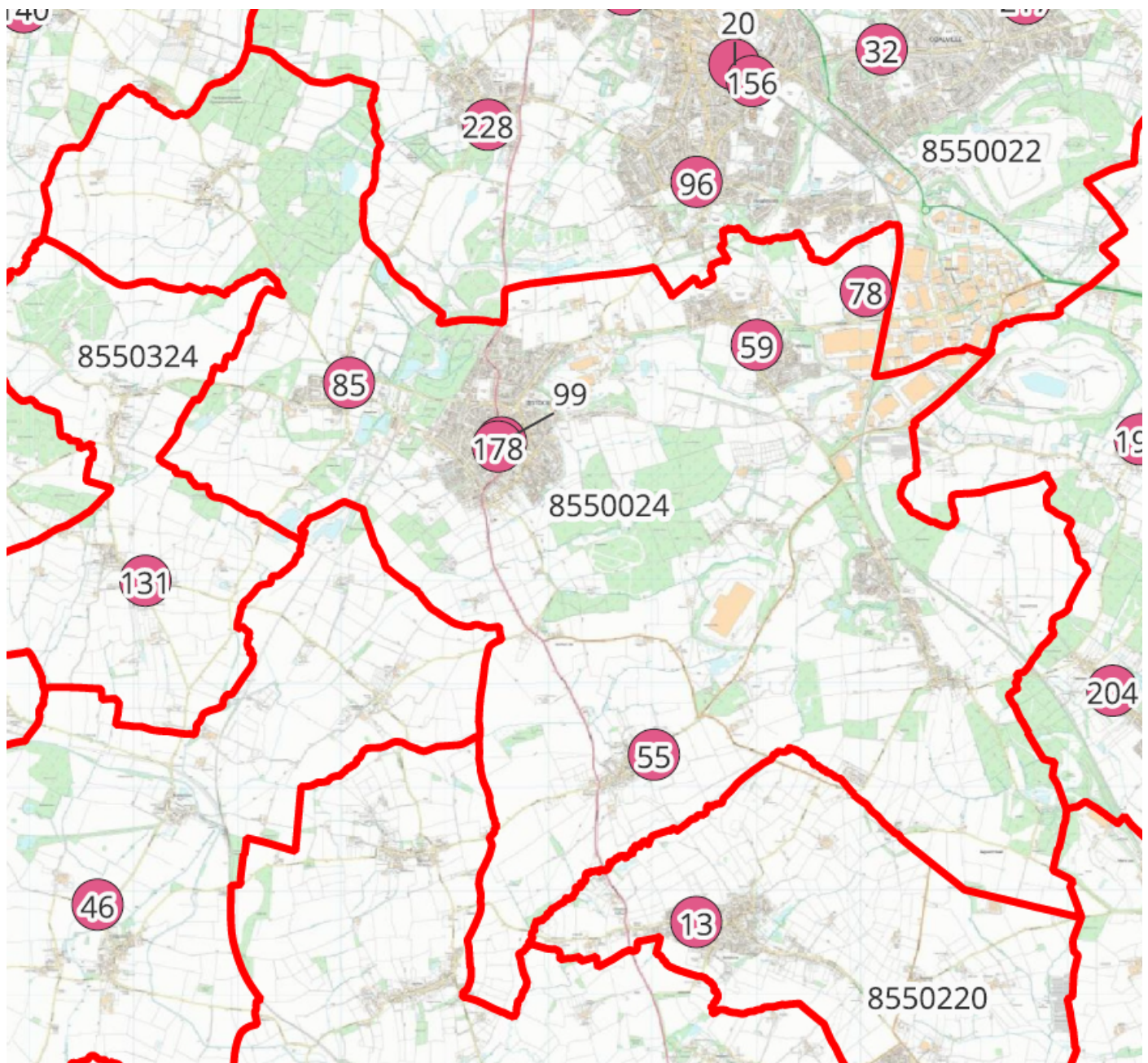

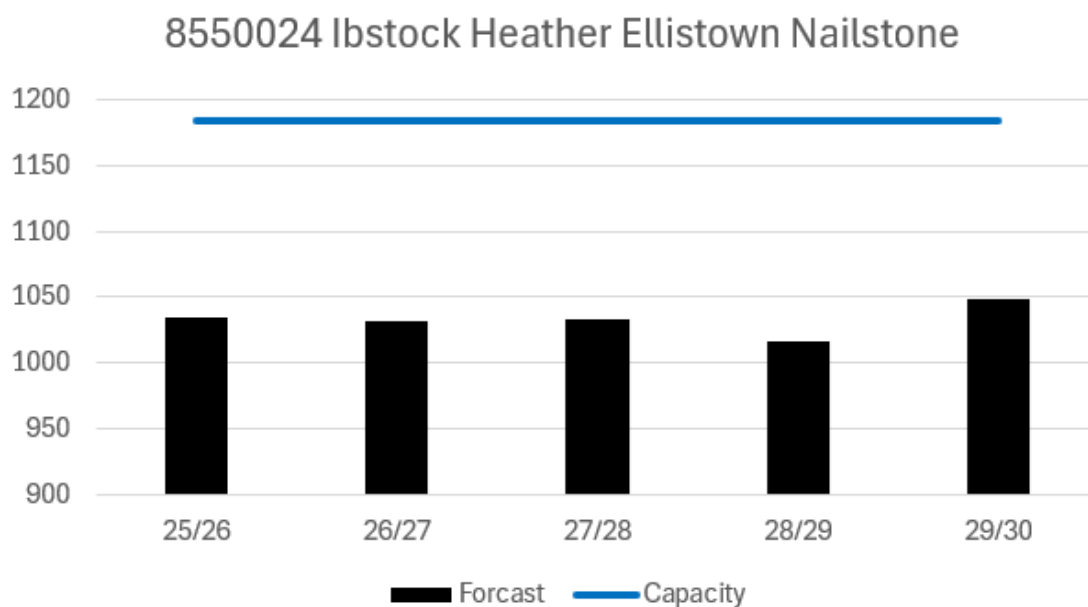

Current Overview

2023 – Ellistown Community Primary – Significant in catchment housing growth. Deficit of school places forecast. However, school does not have room for expansion on current site.

2334 – Dove Bank Primary School – High number of surplus places.

2043- Heather Primary School – Forecasts show healthy number of pupils.

3047 – St Denys – High surplus of places.

2051 - Ibstock Junior School - High surplus of places.

Future Actions

2023 – Ellistown Community Primary – Large housing site of 2,700 dwellings has contributed to high pupil forecasts. Constrained school site and further expansion not possible. Hugglescote Primary expansion, Greenstone Primary, due to open August 2025 and school at Lower Bardon will relieve pressure. Also, Greenstone has capacity to expand by an additional form of entry if required.

3047 – St Denys & 2051 - Ibstock Junior School – Have had ongoing discussions with both schools. St Denys have consulted to reduce PAN for 2027 and Ibstock Junior will follow suit, so it filters through.

Overall, there is capacity within the planning area to cope with projected pupil forecasts and housing growth.

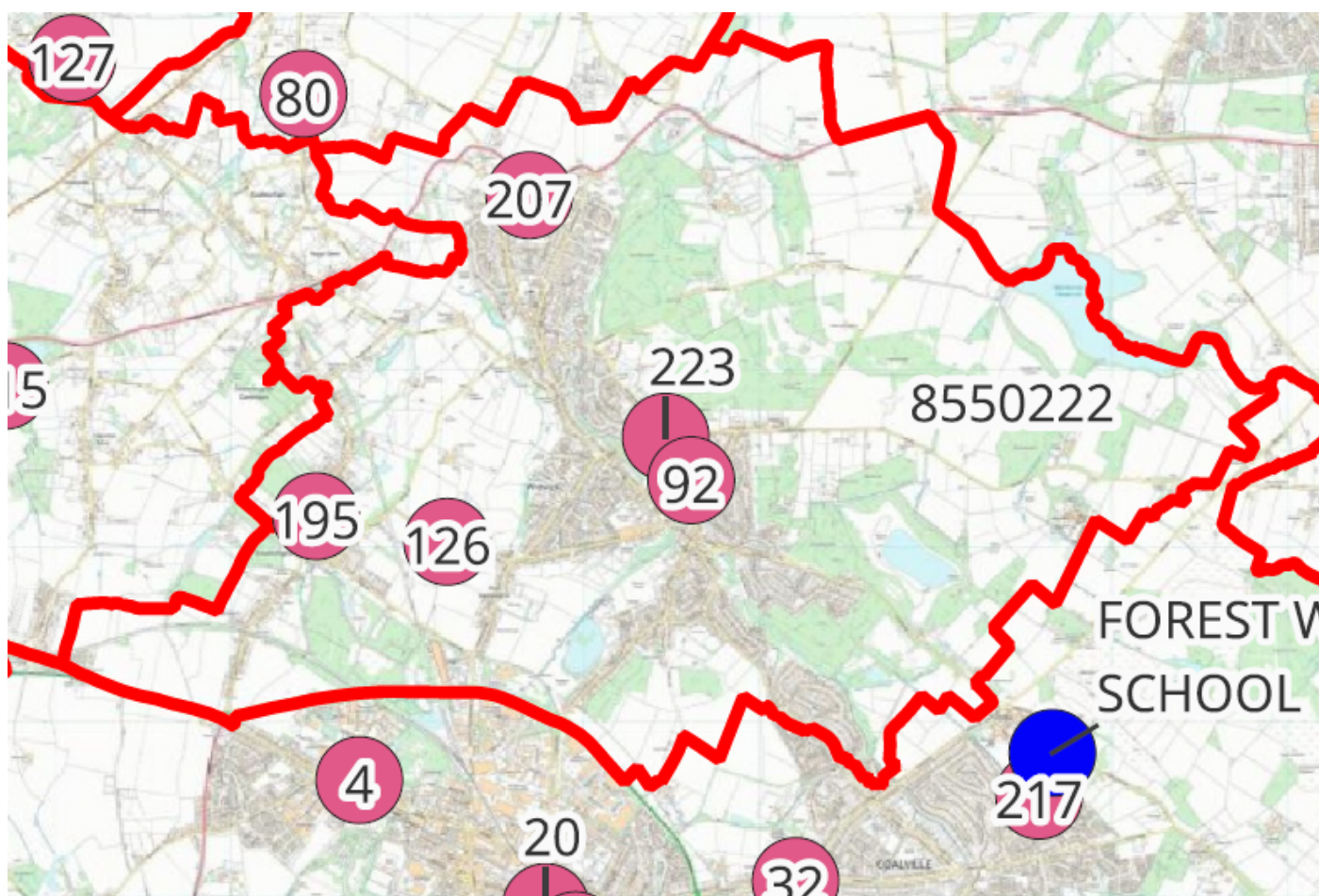

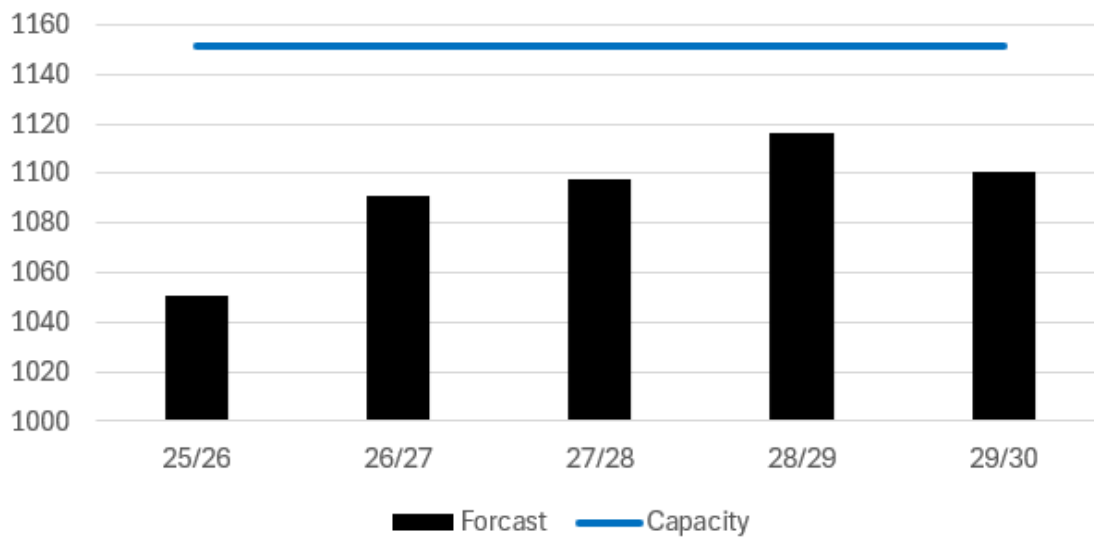


A map showing the Whitwick Thringstone Swannington Primary planning area. There are 5 schools. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.

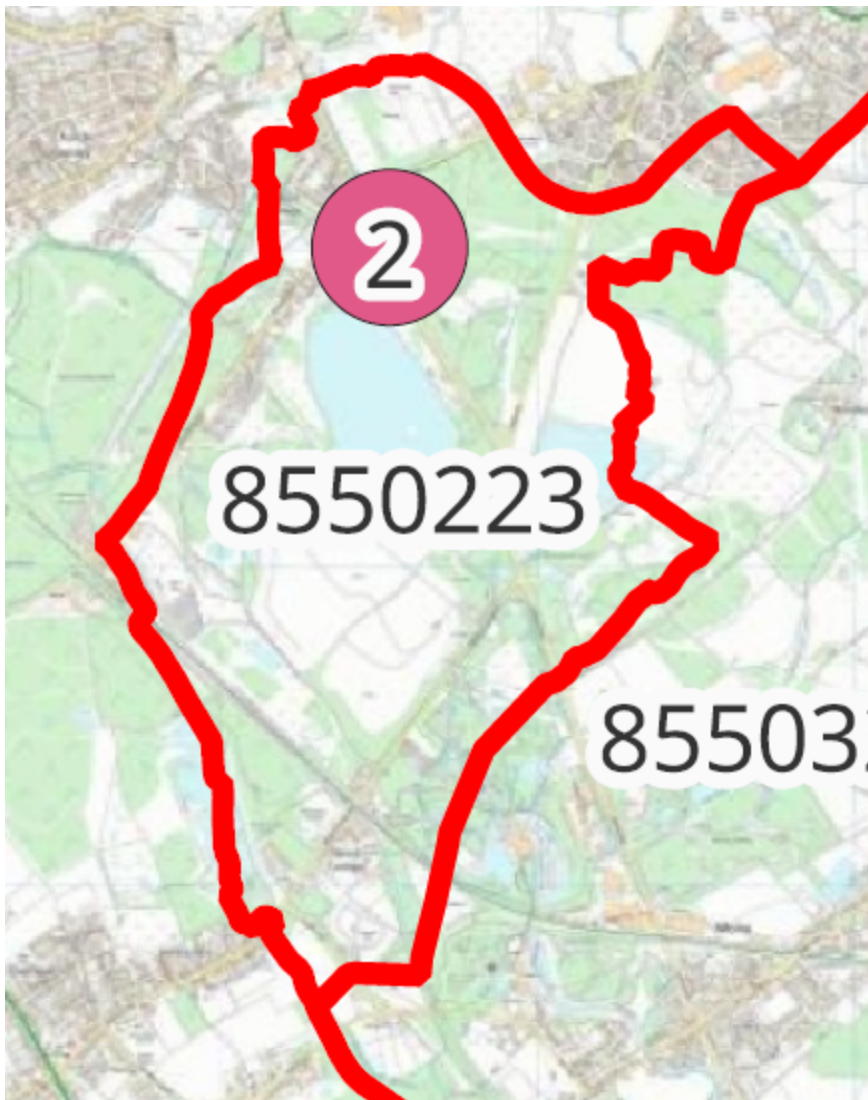

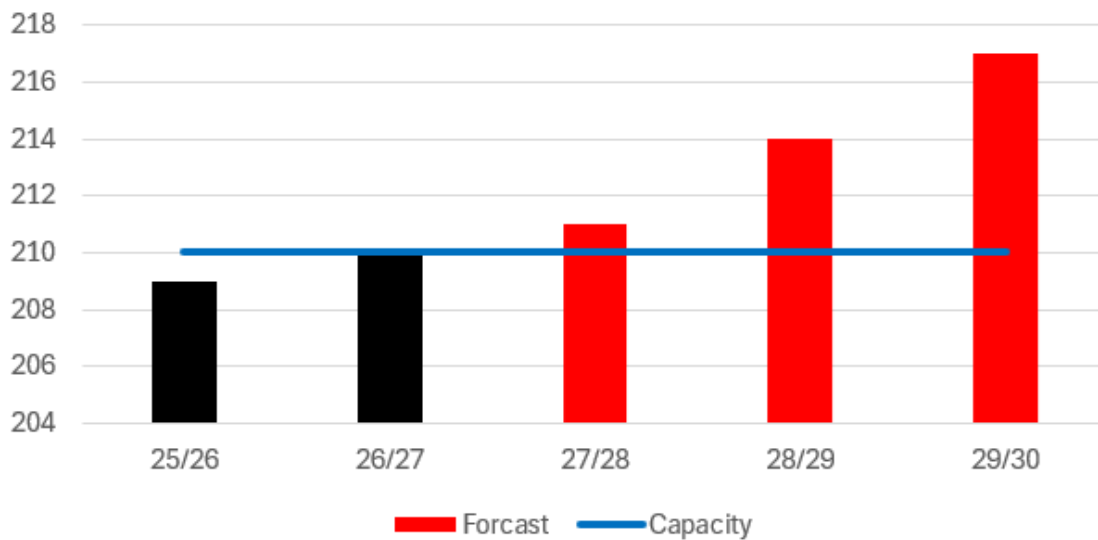


A map showing the Albert Village Primary planning area. There is 1 school. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.

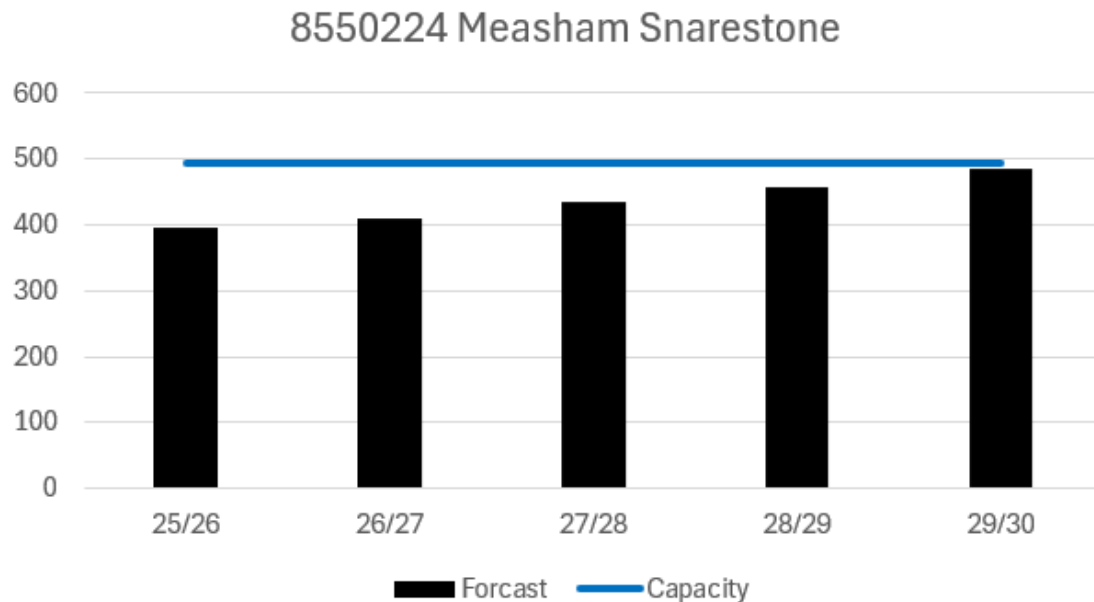

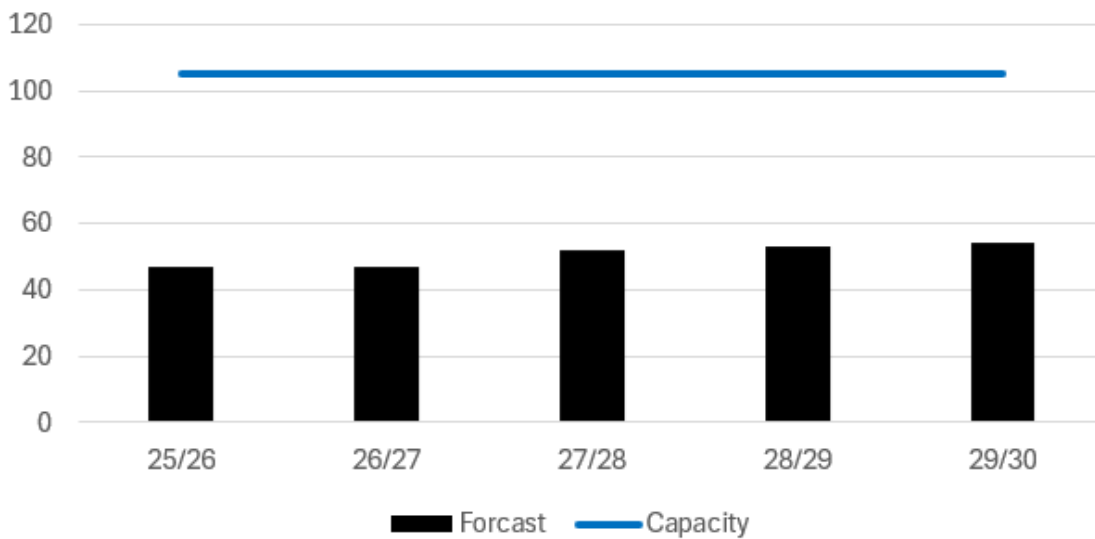

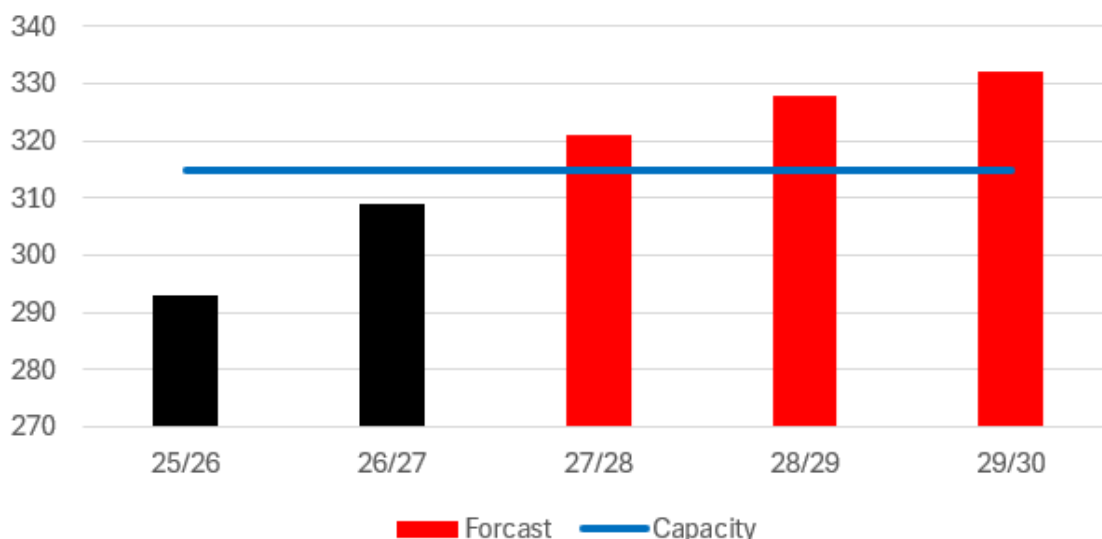


A map showing the Coalville Blackfordby Moira planning area. There are 2 schools. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.

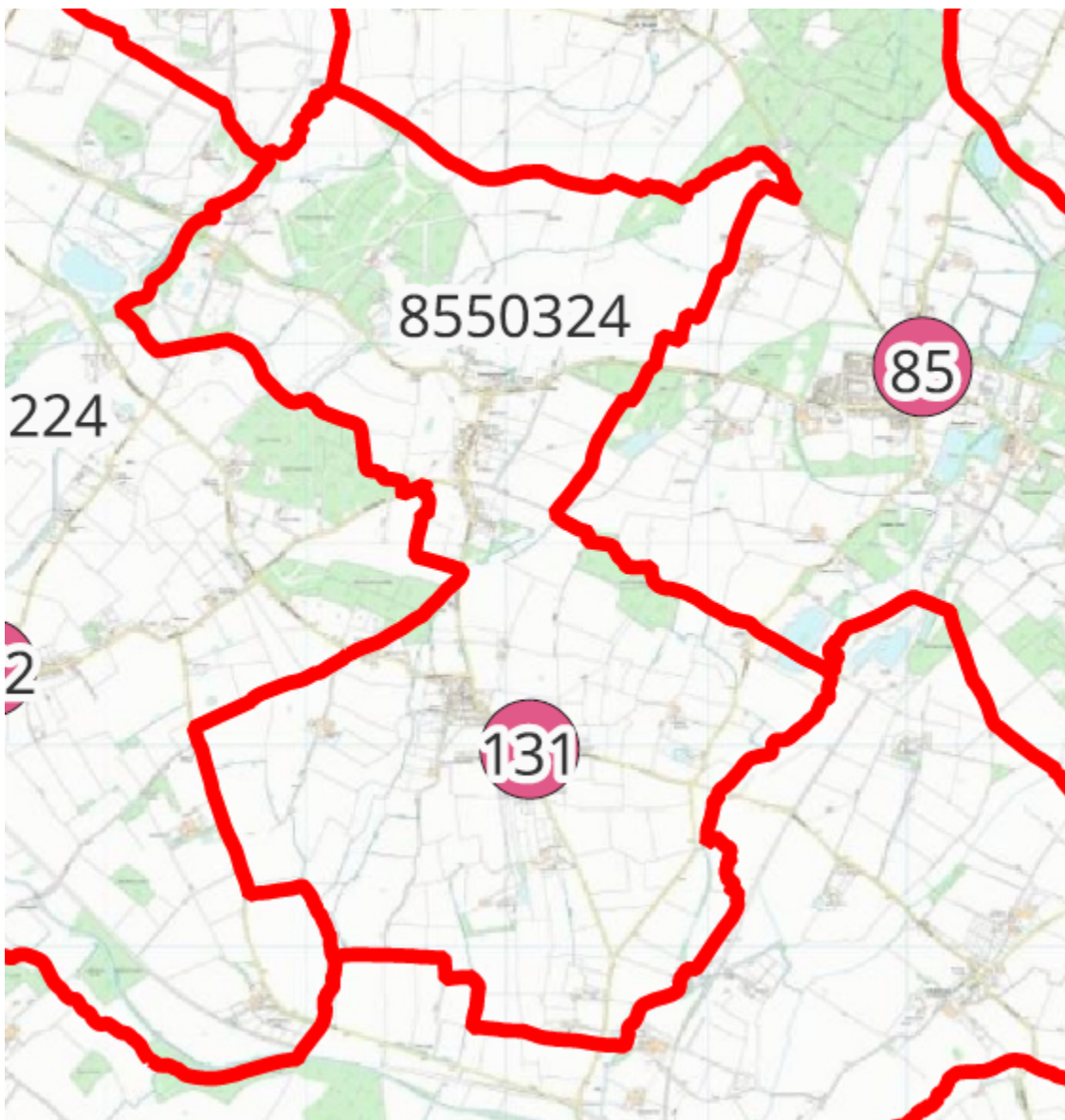

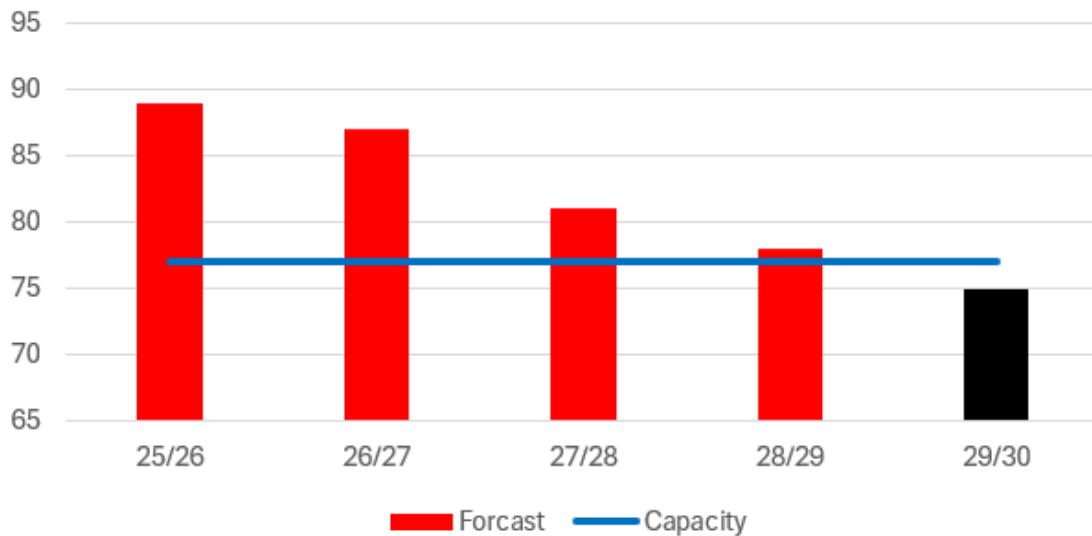


A map showing the Newton Burgoland Primary planning area. There is 1 school. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.

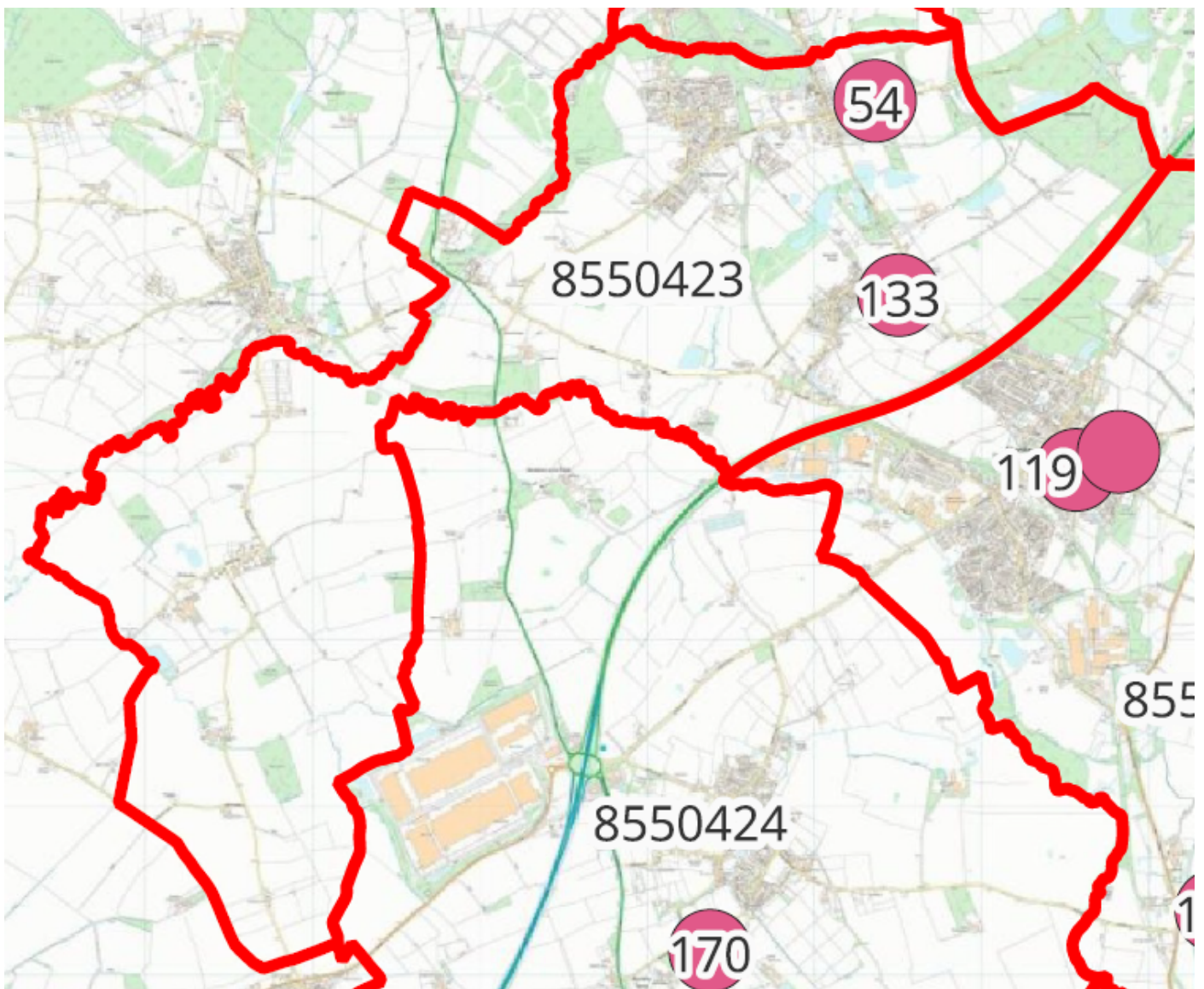

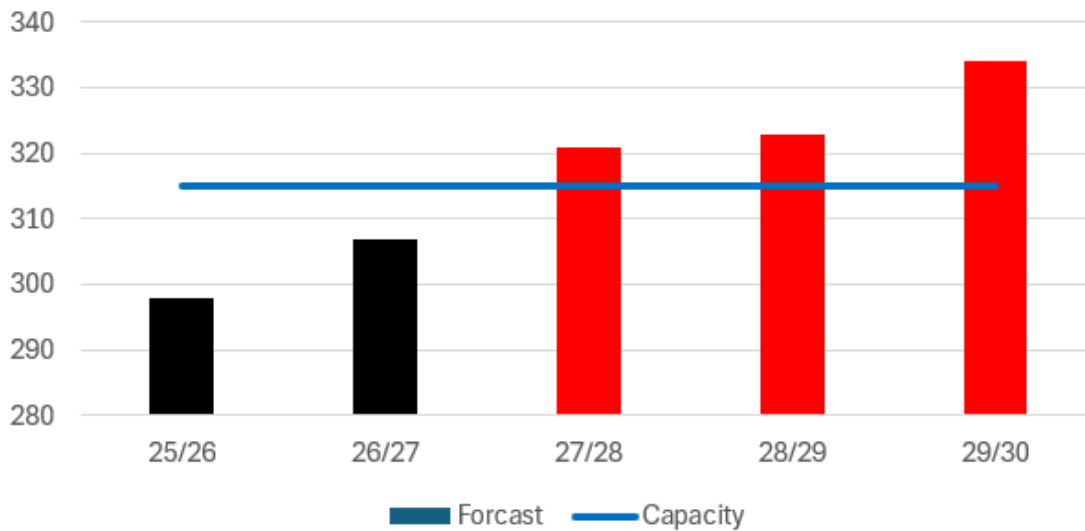


A map showing the Donisthorpe Oakthorpe Primary planning area. There are 2 schools. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.

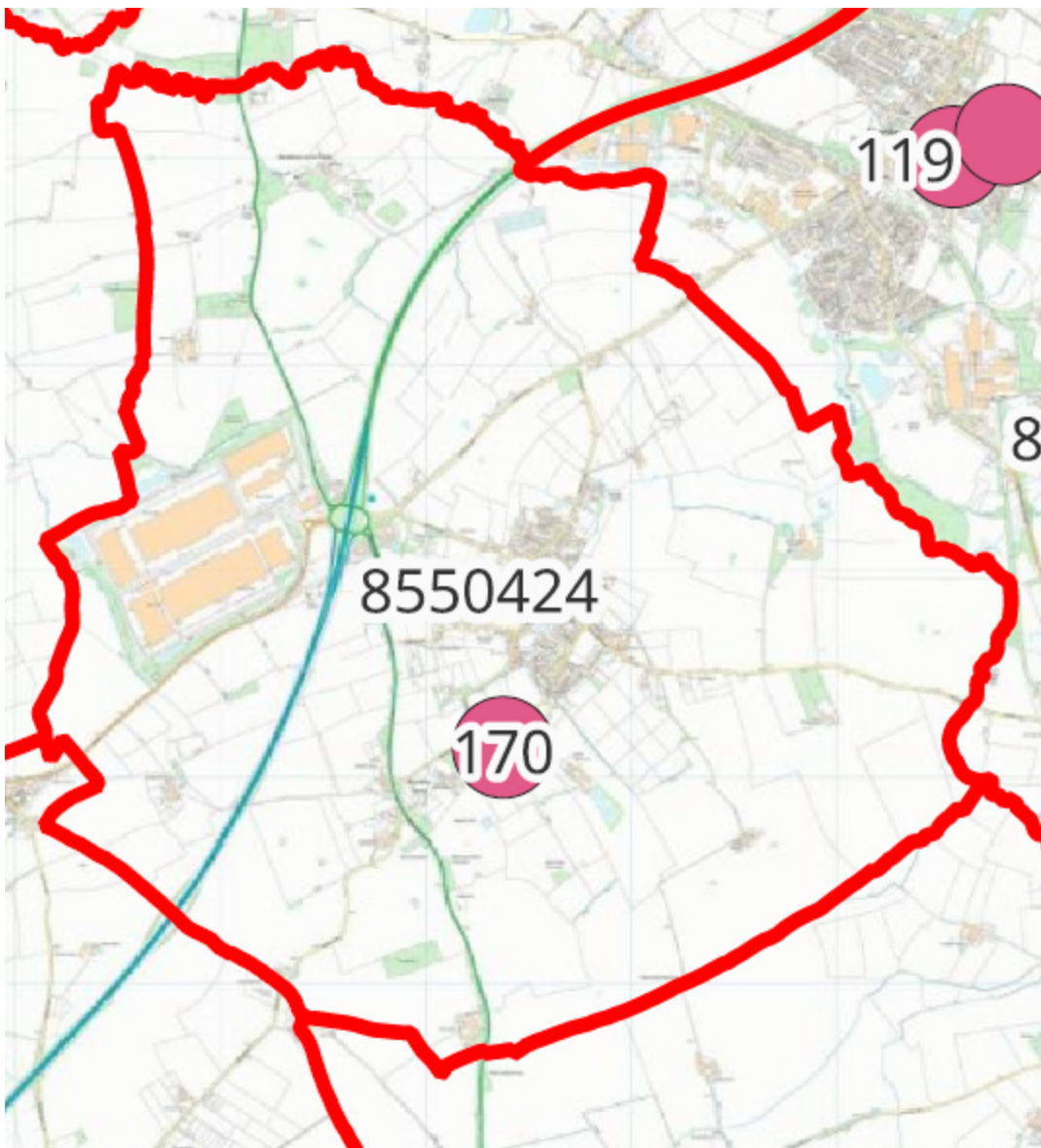

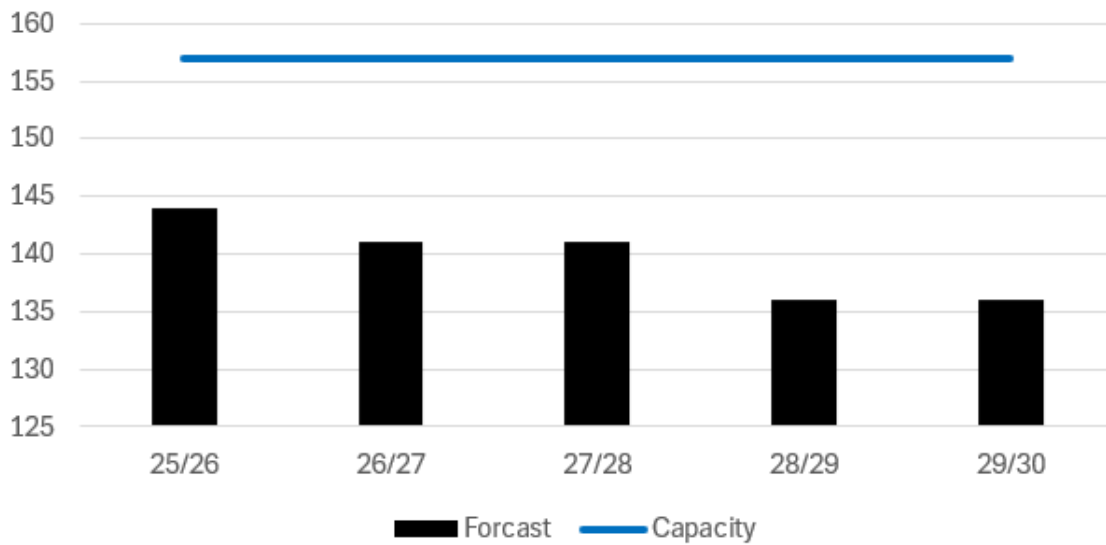


A map showing the Appleby Magna planning area. There is 1 school. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.

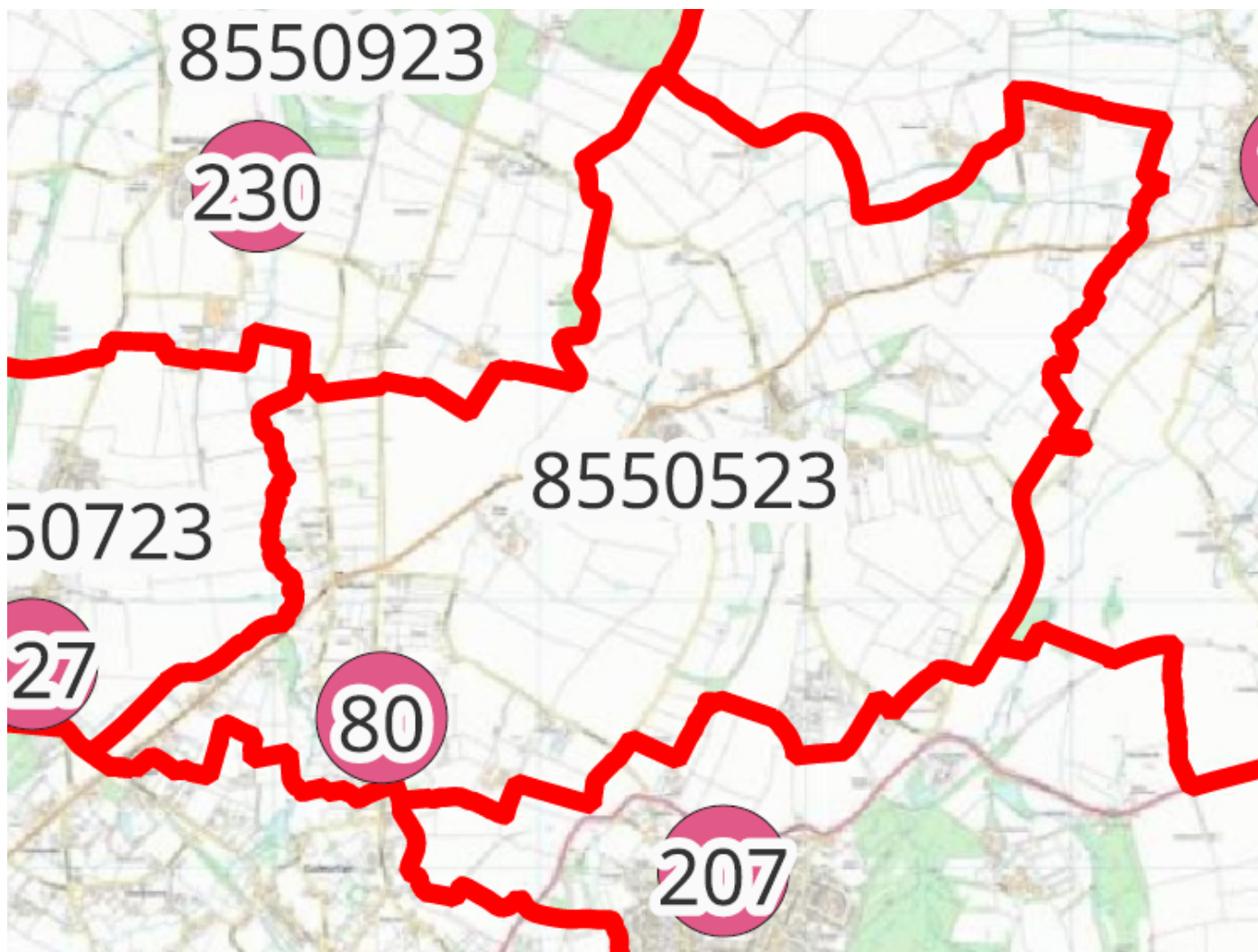

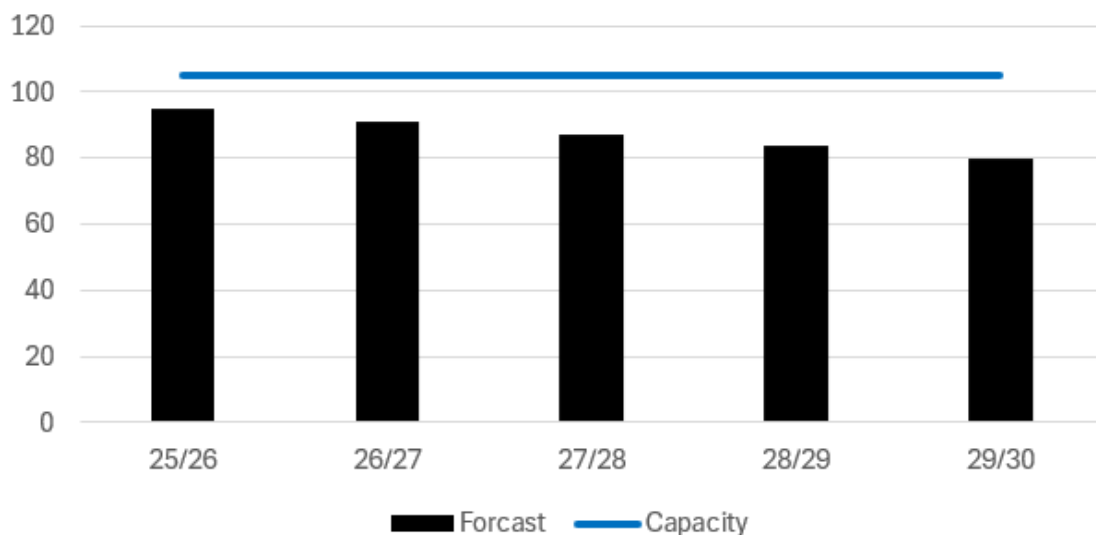


A map showing the Griffydam Primary planning area. There is 1 school. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.

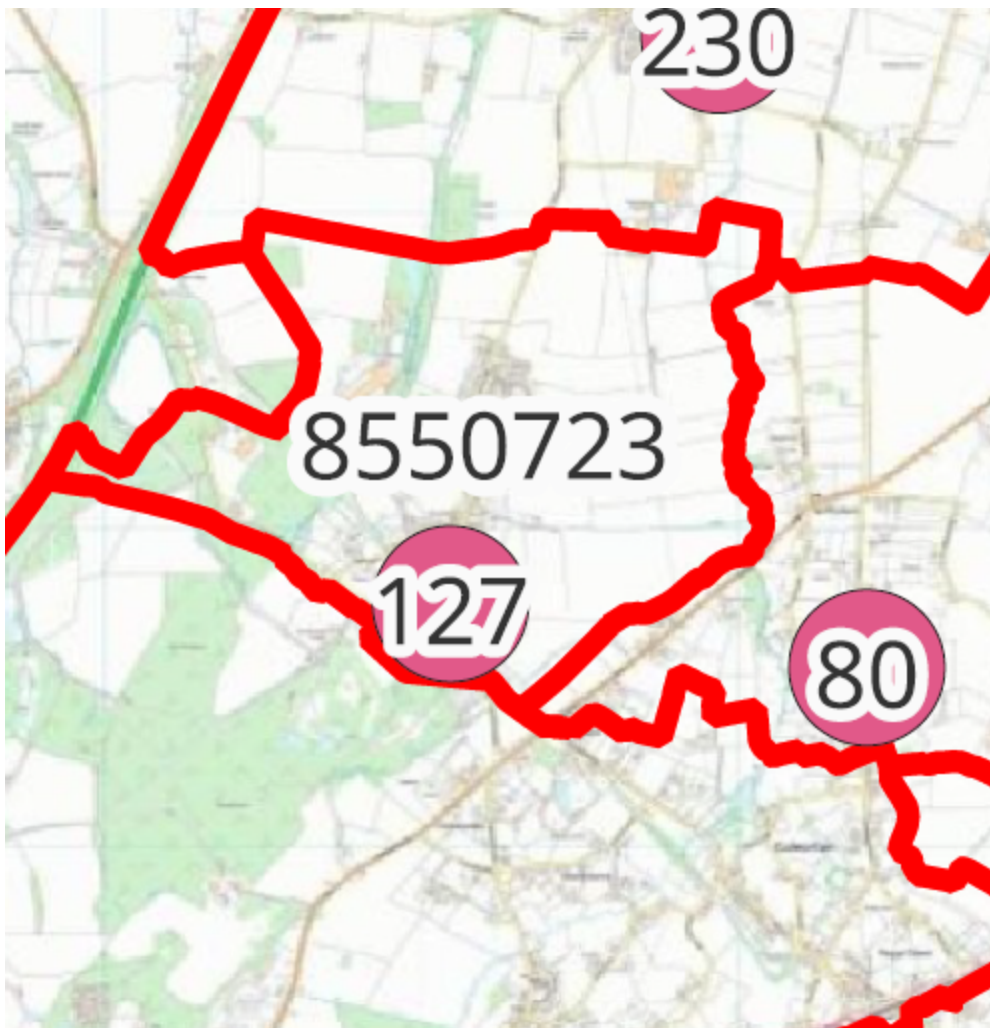

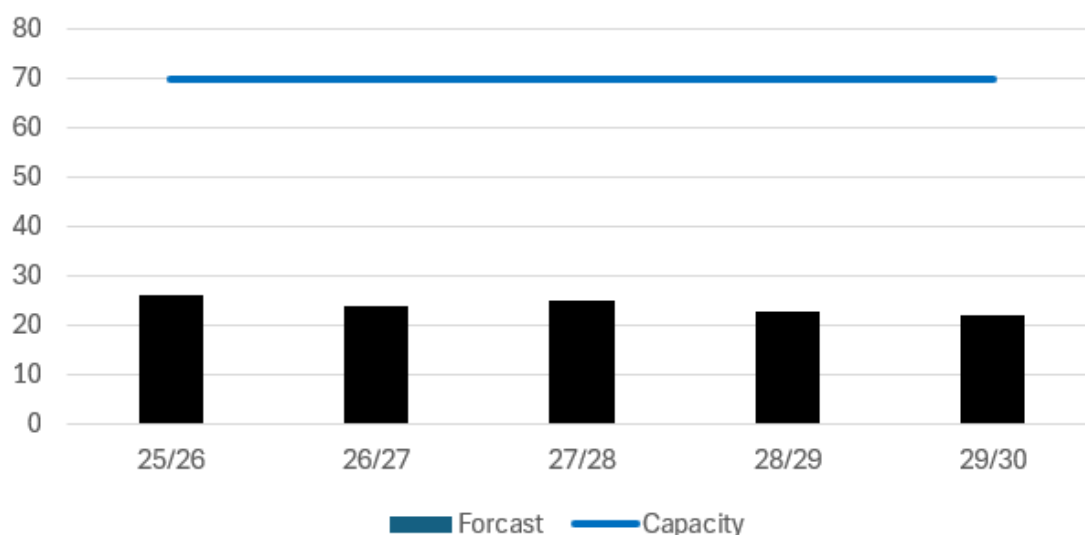


A map showing the Newbold Primary planning area. There is 1 school. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.

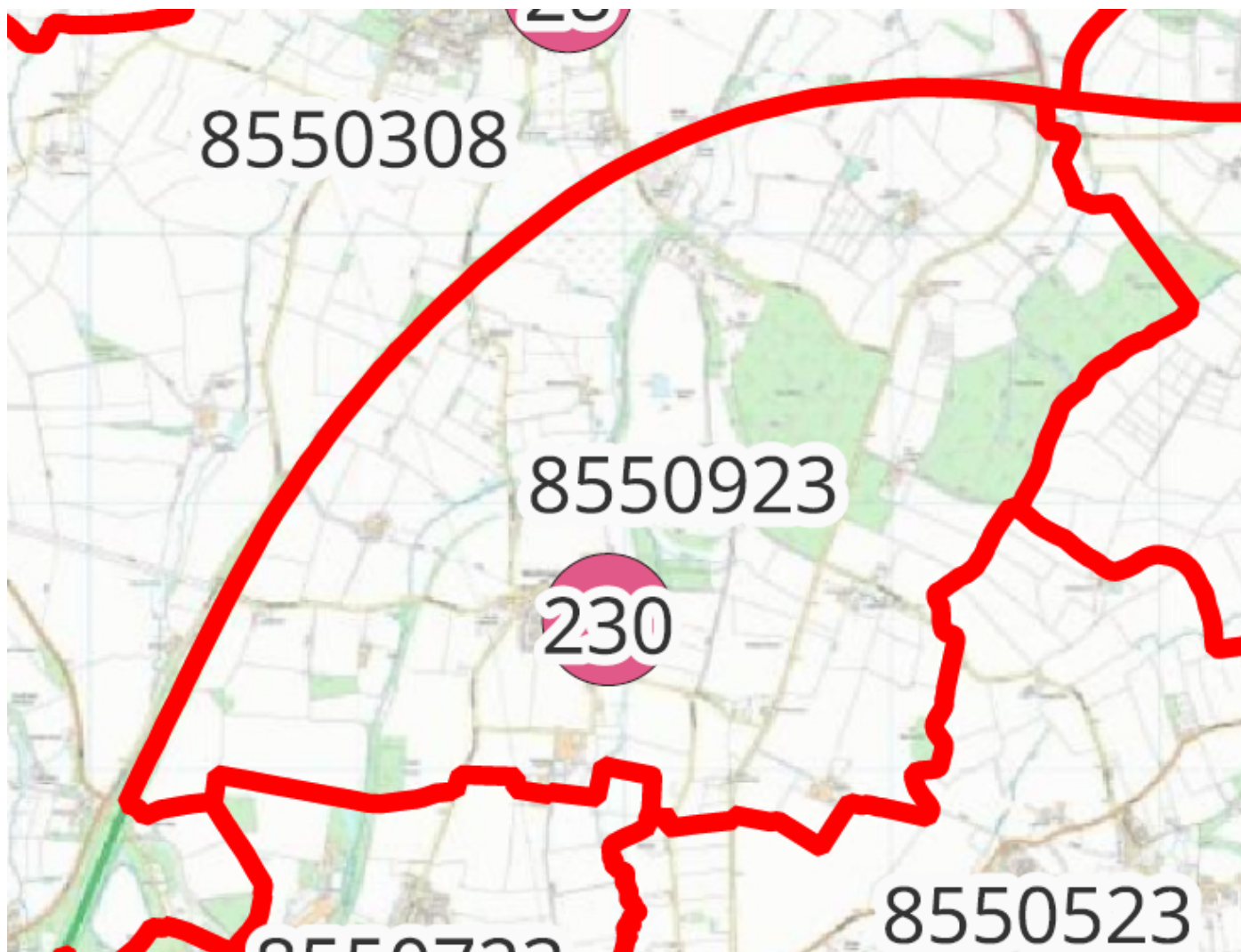

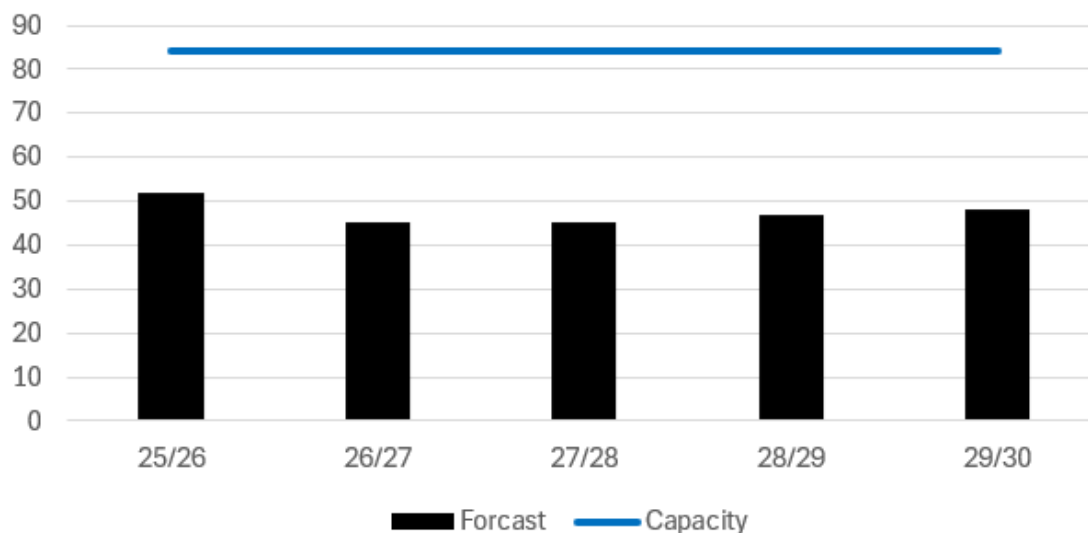


A map showing the Worthington Primary planning area. There is 1 school. The table below provides the map reference numbers alongside relevant school names.
