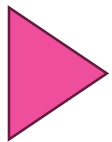


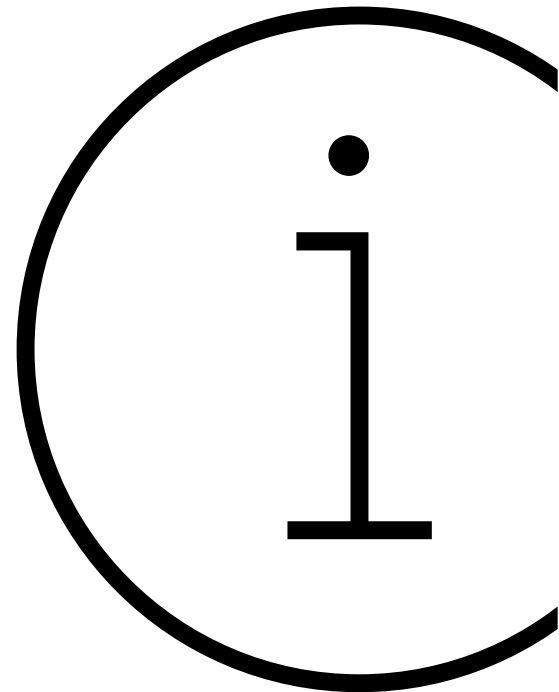
# Leicestershire's Local Offer Annual Report



2025

The 'Local Offer' is the phrase used to describe what is on offer across education, health and social care services for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities and their families across Leicestershire.

The purpose of this report is to share with parent/carers and young people the work that has taken place over 2025 to develop our Local Offer, how we share information about the Local Offer and how we have responded to what children, young people, families and professionals have told us.



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# 1. Key features of the Local Offer

Every local area has to have a Local Offer, as set out in the Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) Code of Practice 2015.

Leicestershire's Local Offer brings together useful information across education, health and social care into one place. It contains a wide range of information, advice and guidance on a range of local service providers who support children and young people with SEND.

## The Leicestershire Local Offer is made up of the following:

### [The Local Offer website](#)

We work closely with the Leicestershire SEND Hub (Leicestershire's Parent Carer Forum) and take on feedback from the experiences of using the Local Offer by SEND Hub members through the SEND Hub representative that sits on the Leicestershire Local Offer Steering Group. We also gather the voice of children, young people and families through events, focus groups and other forms of feedback. We use this information to help us improve the website, plan Roadshows and develop services.

### [Local Offer Roadshows](#)

There are six Local Offer Roadshows that take place across each District/Borough, taking the Local Offer out on the road. A range of service providers are available at each roadshow to speak with parent/carers and other professionals about their service offer.

### [Local Offer Facebook page](#)

The Facebook page contains up-to-date information on activities and events that are available across Leicestershire for children and young people with SEND. Like and follow the page to get regular notifications.

### [Leicestershire Information and Support Directory](#)

The Leicestershire Information & Support Directory sits on Leicestershire County Council's web site. Organisations and providers request to be included within the directory, and a search facility is available.

## 2. News

### News from LCC Children and Family Services and wider partnership

#### ▶ **Leicestershire has a new Assistant Director for Education and SEND**

His name is **Tim Browne**, and he will help look after education, inclusion, and support for children with additional needs.

#### ▶ **East Midlands Youth Inclusion Forum**

Leicestershire has been working with 10 other local areas to create a group for children and young people who are disabled, neurodiverse, or have special educational needs. This group will help young people: - work together and learn from each other - choose the most important things they want adults to work on - make sure leaders listen to what young people have to say.

#### ▶ **Leicestershire Local Inclusion Support Offer (LISO)**

This project is part of a national programme to help schools, families and children get better support. They found **3 main priorities**: -

- **Training:** Give staff in special school units better training –
- **Advice and guidance:** Improve the council website so people can find help more easily –
- **Direct support:** Test new advice drop-in sessions in Charnwood, where school staff and professionals can get help from SEND experts



## Leicestershire Young Voices Project – Shaping the Future of Health Research

Three workshops were held in schools to hear what young people think is important for health and wellbeing in their local areas. They found **6 main things that matter most:**

1. Homes that are roomy, affordable, and modern
2. Feeling safe and protected in their community
3. Looking after and enjoying nature and green spaces
4. Having fun and spending time with friends
5. Places that help people make healthy choices
6. Being close to the things they need and want



## Leicestershire Young Voices Group

We are working with other helpers in our area to make a group of young people. This group will help by telling us what it is really like to live with SEND (special educational needs and disabilities).

The group will decide what is important to them and work on those ideas to make things better for children and young people.

<p>It's difficult to contact the SENA Service?</p>	<p>As part of our strategy to improve communications between SENA and parents/carers, we have launched a new</p>

	<p>approach that allows parents/carers to book meetings or calls with SENA staff. It allows a parent/carer to book a 15-minute online meeting with a member of the <a href="#">SENA Service</a>.</p> <p>We anticipate that this will help resolve a lot of the anxiety and frustration that our families experience when they are unable to speak to someone about their child and receive updates.</p>
<p>How do I request an EHC needs assessment?</p>	<p>In co-production with our colleagues in our parent forum (SEND Hub PCF) and some schools, we have developed and begun using a digital request form for a <a href="#">EHC needs assessment</a> request.</p> <p>The information requested is designed to speed up the process by ensuring that key information is available right from the beginning.</p> <p>Parents and schools are requested to complete an online request and for those who are unable to, we are looking at ways they can be supported to do so. We know that often parents will feel more confident and informed if they are able to complete the request with the child's school and we would encourage parents to do so.</p> <p>As part of the wider work on communications we are looking to provide automated text messaging services to keep parents/carers informed.</p>
<p>The Roadshows can sometimes become noisy and overwhelming for visitors.</p>	<p>We try to ensure that venues are spacious and suitable for the Roadshow but are often limited by availability and cost. We have purchased ear defenders for visitors to borrow whilst attending</p>

	<p>the Roadshow and these have been well received and regularly used.</p>
<p>Sometimes reports take too long.</p>	<p>The Specialist Teaching Service has set guidelines for staff to ensure reports are completed in a timely manner. Reports should be sent to the school SENCO within 4 weeks.</p>
<p>Can the Local Offer Roadshow be advertised more widely?</p>	<p>As well as the usual ways of promoting the Roadshow, we have worked closely with our Corporate Communications Team this year to ensure that the Roadshows are advertised widely. This has included regular press releases for local media outlets to share and linking with NHS Leicestershire to ensure that relevant health services are informed and able to promote where appropriate.</p> <p>The number of Roadshow attendees has increased year on year with a 21% increase in visitors for 2025. <p>Can we have more local organisations attending Local Offer Roadshows? We do have some constraints on the size of venues within each Borough / District to then bring in the widest range of organisations.</p> <p>We do explore local organisations in each Borough / District area and have sent out invites. 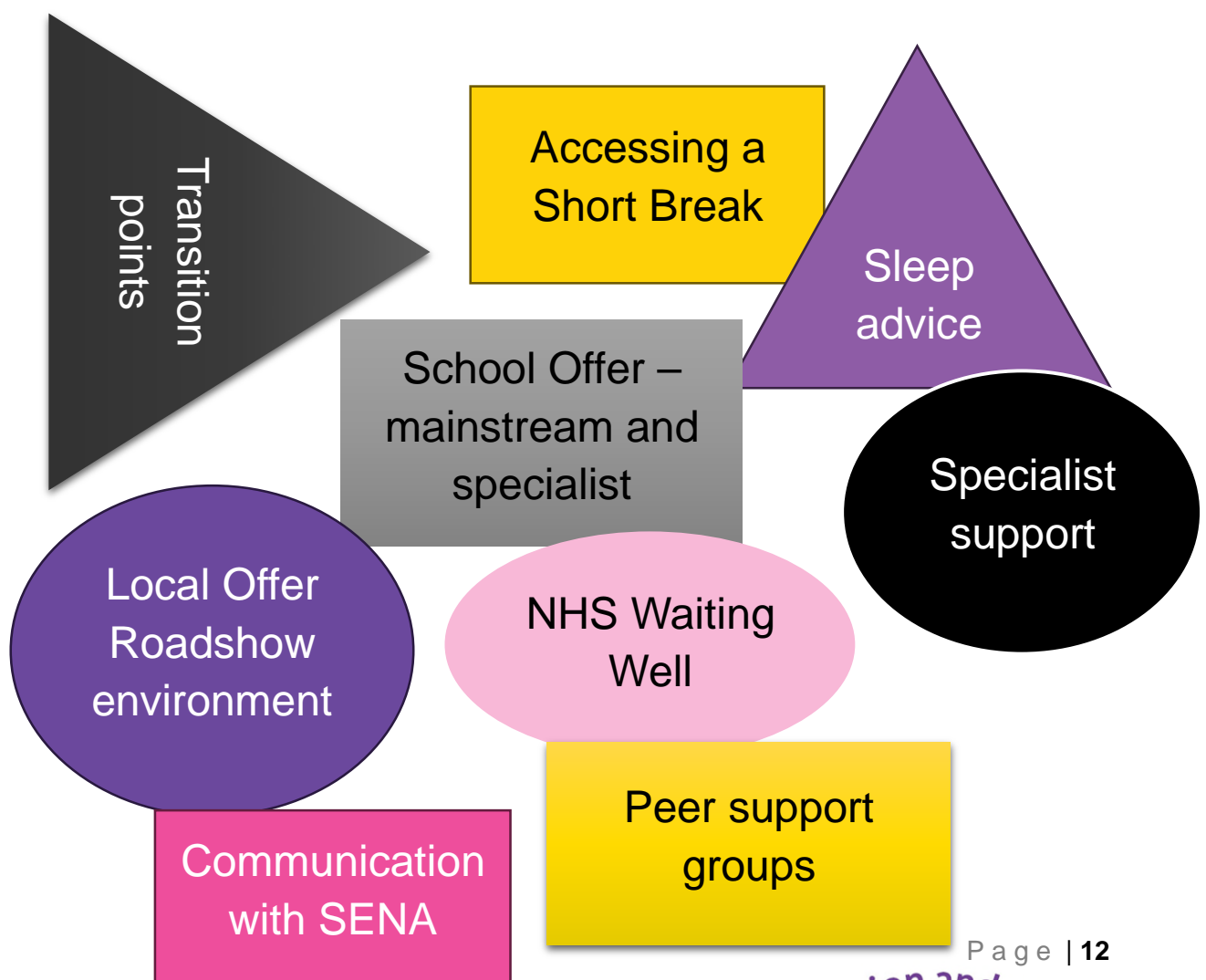

## 4. The Local Offer out in the Community

### School & Parent/Carer visits:

Schools have welcomed the Local Offer to their Coffee sessions for parents and carers with children and young people with SEND. This has included 56 parent/carers and professionals learning more about the Local Offer. These are the main themes coming out of the conversations.



## Local Offer Roadshows 2025

Local Offer Roadshows remain a core element of the Leicestershire Local Offer. An opportunity to speak face to face with services and organisations who support children and young people with special educational needs/disabilities.

Delivered around the County in a variety of accessible venues, the Roadshow offers a warm welcome to both parent/carers and professionals looking to expand their understanding and knowledge of SEND as well as those seeking activities, clubs and post 16 opportunities.

**184** stallholders supported **6** Roadshows around the County (Charnwood, Market Harborough, North-West Leicestershire, Blaby, Wigston, Hinckley & Bosworth), with **589** visitors attending across **2025**. This was a **22% increase on 2024** visitor numbers.

For a second year, we held a children and young people event at the Local Offer Roadshow at County Hall. This attracted over 200 visitors. Check out the amazing fun had by all in the film we created below:

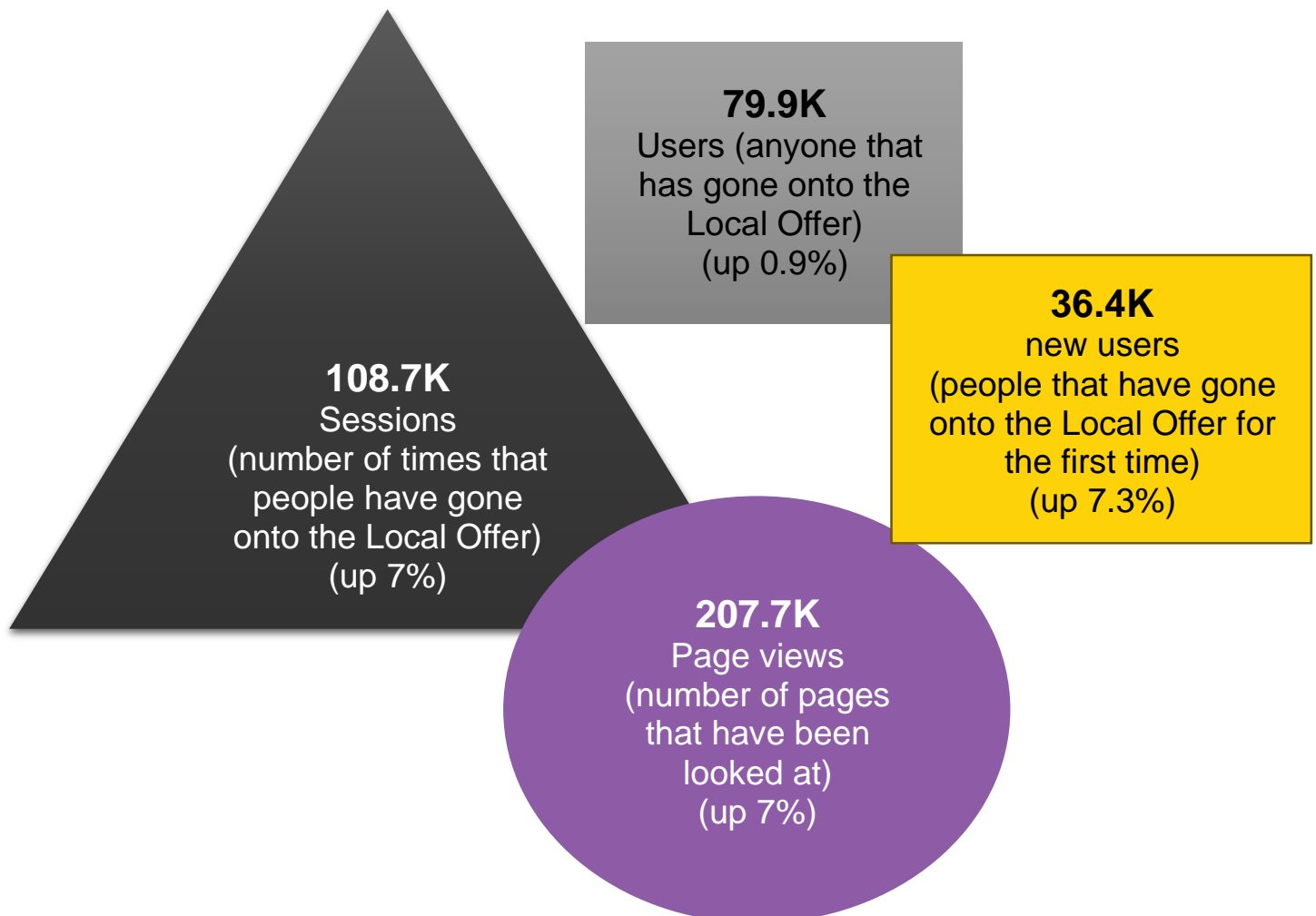
For 2026, we will be combining the Celebration event with the Local Offer Roadshow.

## 5. Local Offer Data - 2025

### Local Offer Website

The data for 2025 continues to show more people using the Local Offer website. Although these are small increases, it shows the gradual improved usage of our webpage, higher page views and a rise in the number of sessions. We continuously review this data to check the output of our work.

The Local Offer uses silktide accessibility checker to ensure its website meets compliance requirements under the Equality Act. Testing accessibility via silktide supports better user experience and increases inclusivity ensuring the Local Offer website can be used by everyone. **Leicestershire Local Offer** was consistently rated **Top 10** throughout 2025.



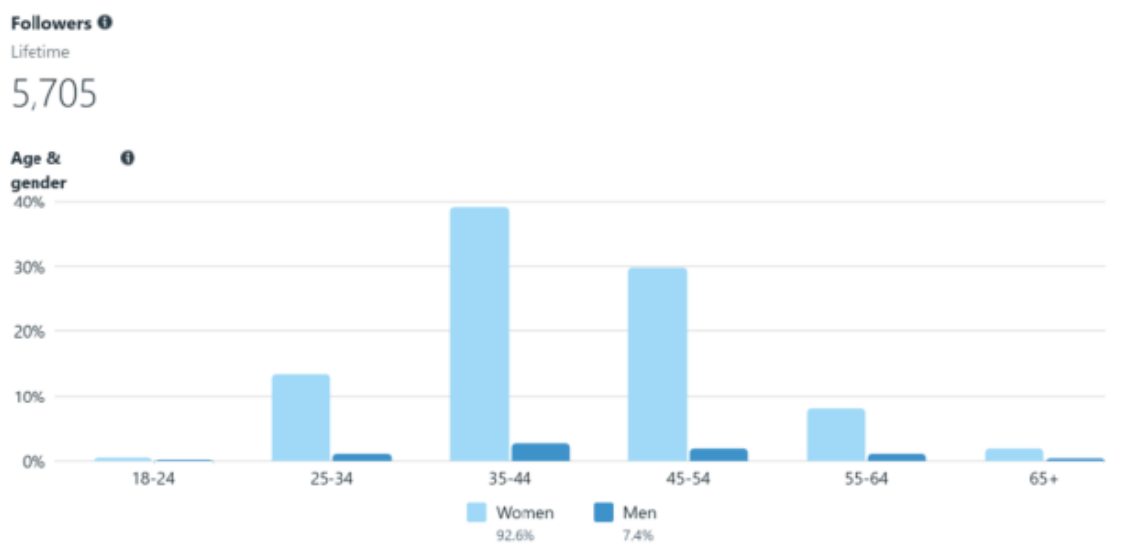
## Facebook



The Local Offer Facebook page continues to be the quickest and easiest way to share up to date information with parents, carers and professionals. With over 5000 followers, interest in the page has increased by 45% during 2025.

The page currently attracts **5.7K** followers, a **24%** increase on 2023 -2024 figures.

There have been 559 posts over 2025 and 6,665 likes, reactions, saves, comments, shares and replies.



We appreciate that not everyone uses social media and we can see from the above data that there are many other platforms which parents, carers and professionals may prefer. We are looking into alternative platforms to add to the Local Offer which will help us to reach a broader audience.

<b>Name</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Active Charnwood</b>	Part of Charnwood Borough Council, <a href="#">Active Charnwood</a> deliver a wide range of sport, physical activity, and health and wellbeing programmes to local residents.
<b>Ambition Sports Coaching</b>	<a href="#">AMBITION</a> is a Sports Coaching and Academic Tutoring company dedicated to providing the greatest opportunities for children and young people.
<b>Arc Foundation</b>	<a href="#">Arc Foundation</a> sessions combine safe resistance training with playful sensory activities, helping your child build strength, confidence and overall well-being while enjoying themselves. Designed to complement physiotherapy and occupational therapy, preparing your child’s muscles for everyday tasks and support important function skills.
<b>Autism Hub Midlands</b>	<a href="#">Autism Hub Midlands</a> provide high quality and accessible autism information, education and coaching for families and carers. Co-delivered by autistic people, families and carers.
<b>Blaby Spartans Football Club</b>	<a href="#">Blaby &amp; District Spartans</a> , the pan-disability football club for adults aged 16 and above also Junior & Youth Pan-Disability Academy for children aged 5-16 years Based in Leicester, we hold our training sessions at Countesthorpe Academy. We welcome players from the surrounding areas and pride ourselves on being an inclusive football club, embracing individuals with various disabilities.
<b>Care Navigation Service</b>	Finding the right sort of help across Health and Care can be difficult so a <a href="#">Care Navigator</a> service has been developed to help you.
<b>Children &amp; Family Service - SEND Youth Groups</b>	<a href="#">SEND Youth Groups</a> are available around the County if you are 11 to 18 years of age. This is an invitation only group especially for young people with SEND. The group provides the young people with a sense of belonging where they can spend time with their peers in a safe space.

<b>Children &amp; Family Service Young Carers</b>	If you are under 18 years of age you can get a <a href="#">Young Carers assessment</a> which may then refer to other organisations that can provide additional support.
<b>Coalville Can</b>	<a href="#">Coalville CAN</a> is a co-operative Community Benefit Society, working alongside local people and organisations to make a difference in Coalville and the surrounding area.
<b>Creating Tomorrow College</b>	<a href="#">Creating Tomorrow College</a> will be opening a Leicestershire campus in September 2024. The college will initially offer a study programme for post 18/19 students with an Education and Health Care Plan to support the development of their character, knowledge and skills to gain and sustain employment in their adult life.
<b>Decode NHS Research Project</b>	The <a href="#">DECODE research</a> team from Loughborough University and Leicestershire Partnership NHS Trust have been investigating how artificial intelligence (AI) can improve care for people with learning disabilities. We would love to talk to you about being involved in our research (and other upcoming projects), either as a participant or in an advisory role as an “expert by experience”.
<b>Define Fine</b>	<a href="#">Define Fine</a> is a parent/carer-led organisation set up in response to the growing number of children and young people who struggle with school attendance, including difficulties sometimes referred to as Emotionally Based School Avoidance, or School Refusal.
<b>Early Years Communication &amp; Language</b>	A countywide service which aims to provide early intervention, and support, to families with children aged 0-5 years to promote the importance and understanding of good communication and language skills. Delivering various one-off workshops across the county, stay and play groups/events to offer support to as many families as we can.
<b>Early Years Inclusion &amp; Portage</b>	<a href="#">Early Years Inclusion &amp; Portage</a> works with children from birth to starting school who have SEND. The team is made up of 3 parts: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Leicestershire Portage Service who works with children from birth to three years, supporting both at home and in settings.</li> <li>• EYSEND advisors who work with children from 3 years to school entry.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Inclusion Practitioners who work with children in their final year at pre-school and into school up to statutory school age who have SEMH needs and are at risk of exclusion.</li> </ul>
<b>ESPO Eduzone</b>	<a href="#">Eduzone</a> provides high-quality, Early Years Foundation Stage appropriate resources that inspire learning and development, including craft materials, furniture, cleaning essentials and more.
<b>Family Hubs</b>	At the heart of our communities, our <a href="#">Family Hubs</a> have been established to support families, children and young people across Leicestershire. Working with partner organisations our Hubs provide a one-stop shop and offer advice, information and resources to help families navigate every stage of life; from pregnancy, through your child's early years, later childhood and into young adulthood.
<b>Family Lives</b>	Becoming a new parent, experiencing couple/relationship difficulties or having parenting challenges, our <a href="#">Family Lives</a> relationship service is designed to support mums, dads and their families through every step of their journey, from perinatal support to teenage years.
<b>Forging Futures</b>	<a href="#">Forging Futures</a> provide young adults with additional needs the opportunity to build confidence, independence, gain work experience and valuable life skills. Having access to a community cafe we offer supported work experience while learning valuable life skills. Our day care provisions foster social skills alongside nurturing community and preparation for adult hood goal.
<b>Forever Savvy</b>	<a href="#">Forever Savvy</a> offers vocational training and support for adults with learning disabilities. We provide outdoor education centres and a café setting with the sole aim of helping people to take their first steps towards employment. Our community projects enable people to work with animals, on the land, or within our very own Tea & Coffee Shop.
<b>FTM Dance</b>	<a href="#">FTM Dance</a> are a performing arts respite service for children, young people and adults with additional needs, disabilities and medical conditions. We offer dance drama and music making sessions as well as creative therapies.
<b>Go Learn</b>	<a href="#">Go Learn</a> offer a wide range of courses for adults (19+) with learning disabilities in venues throughout Leicestershire. Courses provide opportunities for individuals to develop skills and knowledge in key areas

	including: health and wellbeing, work and volunteering, independence, creativity, engaging with the community, numeracy, literacy and communication
<b>Healthwatch Leicester &amp; Leicestershire</b>	<a href="#">Healthwatch Leicester and Healthwatch Leicestershire</a> is the independent consumer champion for health and social care services in Leicester and Leicestershire.
<b>Homefield College</b>	<a href="#">Homefield</a> is a community-based independent specialist college for 16-25 year olds that offers education, training and independent living skills for people with learning disabilities and communication difficulties.
<b>Home from Homecare</b>	Created by a family to make the difference; <a href="#">Home From Home Care</a> provides specialist residential care services to adults (18+) with learning disabilities, autism and complex health and mental health needs. We design bespoke environments and support around each person to enable them to lead an ordinary adult life.
<b>Inclusion Service</b>	The <a href="#">Inclusion Service</a> aims to support all children and young people. We work together with parents, carers and educational establishments to ensure that children can access and be included in good or outstanding educational settings. We also want to help young people to have a successful transition into adult life, through employment, training, or education.
<b>Involve Care and Support</b>	<a href="#">Involve Care and Support</a> , a specialist care provider for people who are diagnosed with Learning Disabilities, Mental Health needs and Autism. We have services all across Leicester that would be able to support people transitioning to adult hood, as well as stepping down from hospital.
<b>Jam Coding (Derby &amp; Loughborough)</b>	<a href="#">Jam Coding</a> deliver fun, engaging computing and coding sessions designed to help every child build the digital skills that will be essential in the future. Our workshops spark creativity, develop problem-solving and resilience, and are tailored to meet the needs of all learners, including those with SEND. We believe that every child deserves the opportunity to explore technology in a safe, supportive environment where they can thrive.
<b>Leicester College</b>	<a href="#">Leicester College</a> study programs are designed with a person-centred approach, offering diverse support to help individuals achieve their unique aspirations and outcomes. We offer courses that cater to learners' various

	challenges, including specific learning difficulties and social and emotional difficulties.
<b>Leicester Wheels for All</b>	<a href="#">Leicester Wheels For All</a> provides all-inclusive cycling opportunities in the East Midlands. We run cycling sessions for anyone with different needs, regardless of age or ability. Trained session leaders support you at our sessions and we have a variety of cycles to suit all abilities.
<b>Leicestershire Cares (Altogether Now Project)</b>	The <a href="#">Altogether Now</a> project works with young people 15-24 years old with SEND working towards outcomes of employment, education or training and building confidence along the way. We do this with a creative and agile approach, using the connections we have with our business members to bring our young people experiences with in employability and the world of work.
<b>LCC Creative Learning Services</b>	<a href="#">Creative Learning Services</a> provides pupil sessions, cultural resources and staff training for schools throughout Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland. Their offer for special schools and learners with SEND has recently been developed. Using professional expertise and carefully selected resources. CLS deliver engaging learning opportunities which inspire pupils with creative activities individually tailored to the needs and targets of pupils.
<b>Leicestershire Down's Syndrome Group</b>	<a href="#">Leicestershire Down's Syndrome Group</a> is run by a dedicated team of parents, who have a person with Down's Syndrome as a member of their family. The group has grown to provide a large support and advice network to many families across Leicestershire.
<b>Leicestershire Dyslexia Association</b>	<a href="#">Leicestershire Dyslexia Association</a> (LDA) is a local charity that works within Leicestershire to support and raise awareness of Dyslexia.
<b>Leicestershire Educational Psychology Service</b>	<a href="#">Leicestershire Educational Psychology Service</a> (LEPs) provide a range of services to the Local Authority and to Leicestershire schools.
<b>Leicestershire SEND Hub PCF</b>	A voluntary organisation of parents/carers working to improve services for children/young people with additional needs/disabilities & their families. The <a href="#">SEND Hub PCF</a> is the strategic partner working with the Local Authority and the Integrated Care Board.

<b>LCC Fostering &amp; Adoption</b>	If you have ever considered <a href="#">fostering</a> or <a href="#">adoption</a> and would like to understand more about the role, then we are here to chat and provide information for you.
<b>Leicestershire County Council Play, Leisure and school aged childcare</b>	Supports families with the inclusion of children with SEND into play and leisure opportunities including out of school childcare and playschemes. This service also offers support and training opportunities to play and leisure providers.
<b>LCC Workforce Improvement – Early Years</b>	The Workforce Improvement Team supports the recruitment & retention demand within the Early Years Sector. We build connections with schools, colleges and training providers to inspire the next generation of Early Years Practitioners to inspire and support a career working with children across Leicestershire.
<b>Lifeways Support</b>	<a href="#">Lifeways Support</a> helps people to lead more fulfilling, independent lives by providing extraordinary support for adults with learning disabilities, autism, physical disabilities, acquired brain injuries or mental health needs.
