A Checklist for Choosing a Care Home

It is worth taking the time to visit a few care homes, look at their brochures and talk to their staff and your family before you make a decision. Make a list of questions to ask before you visit. Don't be embarrassed to ask a lot of questions – this is an important move for you. Talk to the other residents. Ask if you can spend a day there. Most homes offer a "trial period", and if you change your mind later on and you want to move to another care home, then that is your choice. However, the contractual arrangements for placements made by social care services may differ and it is worth clarifying this point at the beginning. Similarly, if you are paying for the stay in a care home yourself you need to check the terms of the contract first. These are some of the questions that you may wish to ask.
