



# Guidance Notes: CROSS SECTIONS FOR CONSENT ACTIVITY

The following activities will require permanent consent; it is likely temporary consent will also be required during the works. If you are unsure please contact flooding@leics.gov.uk








# Creation of a dry working area

The temporary impoundment of water by dam, sheet pile or weir, in order to over-pump water or limit flows, will obstruct usual flow and require temporary consent.




#### Straw bales

The installation of straw bales for silt mitigation measures will impede flow and require temporary consent.




## Silt curtain

The installation of a silt curtain or sediment mats for silt mitigation measures will impede flow and require temporary consent.



# Installation of scaffolding or access platform

Temporary consent may be required depending on the length of the structure and the amount of time it will be placed within the watercourse.



## Temporary flow regulating devices

Installation of temporary devices to control flow for a limited amount of time will impede flow and require temporary consent due to the obstruction to flow.




## Diversion channel

The temporary diversion of a watercourse will require Consent for the length of time the watercourse is to be diverted away from the main watercourse.

#### **DOES NOT REQUIRE CONSENT**

Whilst the works listed below are unlikely to require consent under the Land Drainage Act (1991) the LLFA ask that a courtesy email with a location plan and brief outline of the work be sent to <a href="mailto:flooding@leics.gov.uk">flooding@leics.gov.uk</a> to notify Infrastructure Planning (Flood Risk Management) that works are due to be undertaken close to a watercourse.
