About the Strategy (plan)



What is the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Joint Carers Strategy?

The strategy is a big plan about how we will support carers from 2018 - 2020

It has been written by the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Carers Delivery Group.

This is a group of people who work together to help carers.

The plan was written after they had asked carers about what is important to them.



Who is the plan for?



The plan is for people who look after someone without being paid.

This is called being a carer.

Carers look after someone in their family or a friend, who:

is old,

is ill

has a disability

The plan is also for people who work to support carers



Why do we need a new plan?



We need a new plan because:

- The old plan is too old.
- There are new laws about how we must help carers. This means we have to do what it says in the law
- We want to keep trying to make our services better for people who need them.



What does the plan tell us about carers?



- It says that 1 in every 10 people living in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland is a carer.
- It says that there are about 2000
 young people aged under 15 years
 who are caring for someone in their
 family. These young people are called
 'young carers'
- It says that more women than men are carers
- It says that carers get tired, and need some help for themselves or a break sometimes to help them stay well and happy.
- It says that carers do not always know that they are a carer. They don't know that they do more than other people to support their family or friends.

		The plan has 8 important things that say what we will do to support carers They tell us the right way to do things. They are our aims and goals for supporting carers. We are going to do our best to do all these things for carers				
		The important things are:				
		1.Carer Identification - Knowing who is a carer: This means we will make sure we know when someone is a carer.				
		2. Carers are valued and involved: This means we will talk to carers about how we do things Listen to what carers say and				

say thank you to carers for helping us.





3. Carers are informed:

This means we will make sure that carers have all the information and help to find out what support they can get.



4. Carer friendly communities:

This means we will tell people and groups about carers and how to support them.



5. Carers have a life alongside caring:

This means we will make sure carers and the people they look after get the right kind of support.



This will include

- Having breaks from caring.
- Talking to the places where carers work to help them to support carers.
- We will make sure carers know about health checks they can get.



6. Carers and homes:

This means we will work with other people who work in housing and equipment teams to make sure that they think about what carers might need.







7. Carers can get the right support at the right time:

This mean we will make sure that it is easy for carers to get an assessment. An assessment looks at what help they can get.

We will make sure all the people we work with know where carers can get support.

This means we will make sure that young people who are carers get the help they need.




