
We held a workshop with the leaders of schools opening new provisions to go over all of the above

We did:

We are working with health to plan and prepare for new bases to open

We are ensuring building designs include space for therapies to take place and for visiting staff to work





There needs to be careful design to make spaces calm and inviting so children want to learn.

Class sizes need to be small

Car parking and drop off bays are important

Out door space to play, run and learn will be needed.
