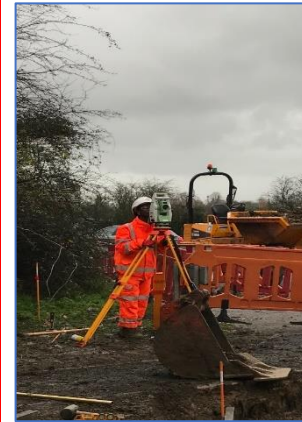

Progress & Upcoming Works

Work carried out in April.

We informed you last month that we are now in Phase 3 of the works on Anstey Lane and working on the final stages of the construction of the new road. We remain on schedule to complete the project on time and within budget.



We have been working on the final ducting connections of the A46 Roundabout, and pedestrian crossing points. We have also been installing the new signal poles, and new sign faces. We have undertaken CCTV surveys.

We have continued to install ducting on Anstey Lane which links the new traffic signal system. We worked on the outbound verge on Anstey Lane, installing the carriageway widening, and top soiling the verge.



The Anstey Lane footpath is now open to the public. We have removed the temporary footpath installed to provide access whilst we completed the main footpath upgrade.



Forthcoming resurfacing road closures

Night Shift Road Closures (between 20:00 & 6:00 Sunday to Thursday only)

A46 Westbound entry slip, from 27th May to 31st May.

Diversion route take A46 to A6 Roundabout and return on A46 Westbound back to Anstey Lane junction.

A46 Eastbound exit slip, from 21st May to 27th May and 1st June – 4th June

Diversion route to continue to A6 Roundabout and return on A46 Westbound back to Anstey Lane junction.

Anstey Lane, A46 to Krefeld Way 26th May to 28th May.

Diversion route to take A46 heading westbound to A50, take the A50 to Glenfrith way, and the Glenfrith Way back to Anstey Lane.
