The plans before COVID-19

Covid-19 is a new illness that has spread around the world.



We have all had to do things differently to keep safe from COVID-19.



Before COVID-19 we did have plans to:

 build a new short breaks place at Smith Crescent Short Breaks Service in Coalville



 have a mixture of people at The Trees Residential Home in Hinckley.



Smith Crescent Short Breaks Service in Coalville

The old buildings at Smith Crescent were not suitable for many of the people who wanted a short break.



We thought that we needed to build some new buildings.



We had to close Smith Crescent to get ready to build the new building.



The Council has had to pause the new building at Smith Crescent because we haven't found a builder who can do the work in the way we want.



The Trees Residential Home in Hinckley

The Trees has recently been improved. The building is now in good condition.



There are 12 beds at The Trees. We have been using 4 for short breaks and 8 for people who live there all the time.



The people who lived in The Trees moved out so that the people who used to go to Smith Crescent had somewhere to go for their short break.



The people who lived in The Trees went to live in new places in their local community.



They are now happy living in their new homes in the community. They don't want to go back to The Trees.



Fewer people want to live in residential care

Residential care is where you live in a large place with other people who need a lot of care.



Fewer people want to live in residential care.



More people prefer to stay living independently with support in the community.



Fewer people are wanting to live in places like The Trees.

What we are suggesting for short breaks



We are suggesting to close the service at Smith Crescent and use all 12 beds at The Trees for short breaks.



This means there are an extra 2 places for short breaks in the county.



There used to be 22 spaces for people to be on a short break in Leicestershire. With this suggestion there will be 24.
