



- 1. Making a texture board or book together is a great way to introduce words for different textures.
- 2. Choose items with a variety of different and interesting textures for your child to touch and feel.
- 3. Talk to your child about what they feel like e.g. 'soft cotton wool and where they are going to place them on the board/paper, following your child's lead
- 4. Give 2-3-word instructions such as 'stick it on.'

N.B: if your child doesn't like to have sticky fingers, use a spreader for the glue e.g. lollipop stick



What's

next?

- Create a texture board to reflect a special day trip or trip outdoors e.g. nature walk, gathering leaves, flowers, twigs, stones.
- Encourage your child to sort and arrange textures e.g. by colour, feel.
