

- 1. Give y rattles
 - 1. Give your child different objects to explore, e.g. spoons, shiny paper, empty pots, rattles and shakers.
- Steps: 2. Crumple up bits of paper or bang objects together to make interesting noises and encourage your child to copy you...
 - 3. Talk to your child and make babble sounds to him/her. Follow your child's lead and if they make a sound then copy that sound back. Imitate their expressions and noises. Stop and give him/her time to make sounds back to you.
 - 4. Now switch roles and make a face, then watch their intense expression and see if they try to imitate you. Your child will be learning to take turns when you play this game!
 - 5. Be sure to pick up on their cues and when they are done playing and look away, stop. When they look back at you then smile and begin again.
 - 6. Allow your child to play for as long as they are interested. You can repeat this activity again and again.



What's

Play social games with your child, e.g., pat-a-cake and peek-a-boo. Your child will enjoy playing these games again and again, and this repetition helps your child to learn.
