These are the main points that should be considered when producing a supporting statement

What are you proposing to develop (description of elements of proposal, working, construction, restoration, afteruse)	
Need of the proposal (justification of the proposed development)	
History of the site (provide details of previous planning permission / operations on site)	
Existing situation / operation / characteristics	
Are there any ancillary development	
Duration of operations (timescales and working hours)	
Environmental impacts (noise, dust, odour, landscaping, transport, access, rights of way, TPO's, geology, hydrology, drainage, archaeology, ecology, lighting, agricultural)	
Design implications	
Employment implications	
Alternatives solutions	
Mitigation measures	
Type of plant / machinery	
National, Regional and Local Planning Policies	
Is the proposal contrary to the Development Plan (this should be made clear when submitting the application)	
Planning Applications which meet the criteria with Annexes C and E of PPS25 will require a Flood Risk Assessment	
Waste (type of waste to be managed, annual throughput, capacity of the site, management of leachate, recycling, reuse, waste hierarchy)	
Minerals (type of material to be extracted, landbank, apportionment figures, extraction rate, depth, existing sources of mineral in the area)
